

Knit & Stitch

Tuesdays @ 1:30 pm to 3:30 pm

Our Knit and Stitch program will continue throughout the summer. This is a great place to share your interest whether you're a beginner or pro. Bring your handiwork and spend some time with fellow knitters. All levels of skill welcome. Wool and patterns available. Bring your own needles.

Knitting Techniques: GARTER STITCH

This is the most basic of all stitch patterns and is achieved by knitting every row. The result is a flat, reversible, ridged fabric that stands up well to wear and does not roll at the edges.

Here's how to do it: When you get to the end of your first row of knit stitches, transfer the full needle to your left hand and start the process of knitting each stitch all over again. After several rows you'll begin to see the fruits of your labour, and in time your growing strip of garter stitch will start to look like a real piece of knitted fabric.

FROM THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT

Well, another Calmar Fair Days has come and gone and I think we did okay.

Leading up to the event the weather was not promising at all. Friday was supposed to be kind of cool with high winds while Saturday was going to be a little less windy but still breezy enough to threaten the fireworks. I was prepared to have to cancel either the Movie Under the Stars, the fireworks, or both. As it turns out, Mother Nature decided she also wanted to be Mother Nurture and, after deciding to go ahead with setting up the inflatable movie screen Friday night, the wind drastically subsided. As a result of this the Movie Under the Stars ran from start to finish for the first time in a few years. An audience of approximately 60 people took in the live action version of Dumbo but as the temperature plummeted during the evening, only about 10 hardy movie fans made it to the end credits.

Saturday ended up being a pretty sunny day with minimal wind, meaning the fireworks were a 'go'. The parade saw 27 entrants, including all the kids who took part in the Kid's Bike Parade. Congratulations to Hawkstone Stables for winning Best Overall.

The Mega Market did good business as can be evidenced by the successful day many of the food vendors had. The JDRF pancake breakfast exceeded their projected numbers by 25% (over 800 plates!), the BBQ at the Legion moved a lot of burgers and dogs, Alberta Milk came to town with 500 units of product and they ran dry by 1:30. Coffee, Pucks, & Poutine did solid numbers at the arena, Lee's was hopping, and Smokin' Barrels won rave reviews and actually had to buy more French fries.

The kids activities saw the usual long lines for the bouncys, petting zoo, and face painting and the return of the climbing wall proved very popular. The fireworks had to be shifted due to new housing construction but other than this minor starting location change, everything was pretty much the same as we had another spectacular end to a Calmar Fair Days Saturday. Thank you once more to Direct Line Insurance for donating face painting supplies and to Lattman Equipment Ltd. for donating generators and lights for the kids' activities and the ball tournament.

The Getaway program is finished for another year and while numbers were down from last year's phenomenal 58, the kids that were registered this year had a good summer. I will admit there were some hiccups (the worst had to be rain ruining what was a great trip to the Ukrainian Village) but things will be reviewed and hopefully next year we'll see things firing on all cylinders again as we tweak the things we can control (unlike the weather).

With the kids getting back to school that can only mean that ice at the Mike Karbonik Arena will be going in soon. This year the process will be facilitated by the 2 new dehumidifiers that were installed in August. In addition to making ice installation easier, the dehumidifiers should also make it more enjoyable for ice users and spectators alike as the air shouldn't have as much of a bite anymore.

Also in August a new trophy case was installed to replace the Minor Hockey trophy case that came crashing down the day after the ice season ended last March. With the design of the new unit the chances of a repeat incident should be pretty small.

On the 12th of this month is the annual Community Awareness Night. For those who are interested in minor baseball, this might be of special interest to you this year as there is someone who wants to try and get minor ball in Calmar going again and he might have a table on this evening.
