

Every year the Library Board submits their operational budget for approval from the Town of Calmar Council. # Town of Calmar 2021 Municipal Election Newsletter MARCH 15,2021

October 18th, 2021 brings us to another round of Municipal Elections, across Alberta, for the positions of Mayors, Reeves, Aldermen and Councilors for local jurisdictions. In Calmar, residents will elect a Mayor and four Councilors. Nomination forms for the Mayor and Councillors are now available on the Town's website or are available at the Town Administration Office located at 4901 – 50<sup>th</sup> Avenue. All persons wishing to file a Nomination Paper and Candidate's Acceptance form, with the Returning Officer, must also file a Candidate Information form. Any eligible person may file a nomination with the Returning Officer at any time during regular business hours between January 2, 2021 and 12:00 noon on Nomination day, which is four (4) weeks prior to Election day which will be September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021. You can access the forms available at the Administration Office by ringing the doorbell at the front entrance, Monday – Friday 9:00am – 4:30pm (closed from 12:30pm – 1:00pm for lunch). Watch the Town's website at <a href="https://www.calmar.ca">www.calmar.ca</a> for any changes in business hours that <a href="may occur due to COVID">may occur due to COVID.</a>

Election Day will be Monday, October 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and voting is planned to take place between the hours of 10:00am and 8:00pm at a Voting Station, the location of which is to be determined due to Covid-19 and social distancing restrictions. Watch for further information in this regard.

For those unable to vote on Election Day, an Advance Vote is proposed to take place on Saturday, October 9<sup>th</sup>, 2021 between the hours of 1:00pm and 4:00pm, again at a Voting Station location to be determined.

<u>All candidates</u>, whether nominated for Mayor or Councillor, should review Section 147 of the Local Authorities Election Act and make themselves aware of their responsibilities in regard to reporting campaign financing and expenses whether a candidate is elected or not.



#### **BLACK KNOT FUNGUS**

Black knot is a fungal disease caused by the fungus *Apiosporina morbosa* (formerly referred to as *Dibotryon morbosum*). It affects mainly plum and cherry trees in North America.


The disease produces rough, black growths that encircle and kill the infested area, providing a habitat for tree damaging insects.

If left untreated, black knot can limit the life span of a tree. Control of black knot requires both prevention and sanitation.

- Inspect your trees during dormant season
- Prune out all infected branches in late winter (late February through the mid-April)
- Remove at least 4-6 inches of healthy tissue below each knot to ensure elimination of fungus
- Make sure to safety discard the infected stems and branches by throwing them in the trash or burning them
- Sanitize your pruning tools with 70 percent rubbing alcohol to prevent reinfection.
- A severely infected tree should be removed completely
- Continue to monitor the tree in the following months and years to detect newly infected parts early.




