

I would like to take this time to thank the many people who contacted me about the removal of the Hotel and the house beside the Library. Council will **NOT** be raising taxes to remove the Hotel. Council will work with the owner to have the Hotel removed. This is going to take some time, but like the damaged house on main street, one day it will be gone!

The Fire Department has just taken delivery of their new fire truck and I would like to thank Chief Brooks and his Firefighters on doing a job well done to keep our community safe. On a sad note and on behalf of Council and myself, we would like to express our sorrow to the two families for their loss in the latest fire in town. Many thanks to the people who stepped forward to help their neighbors in their time of need. It is nice to see that the people of Calmar step up when the need arises. This is what makes our community a great place to live!

We are very excited to have hired a new Special Constable for the town. Mr. David Vanden Brink just retired after a 37 year career with the R.C.M.P. David's training, education and experience are a huge asset to our community! Please help Council and Administration welcome David to our community!

Calmar's Secondary School has started its re-modernization. There was a bit of a delay with the election and change of Government. It is now full steam ahead with completion of the re-modernization slated for September 2017.

Administration is working on a couple of grants for projects within our community. We have set up a Fire Hall Committee to look into the design and building of a long needed Fire Hall. We are applying for a grant through the Federal Government to make needed repairs to the Skating Arena. The Recreation Board is also looking at plans to construct soccer fields, a camp ground, a playground and four ball diamonds where the ball diamonds are presently located and continuing further to the south.

We are very lucky to have the Unique Market at the Mike Karabonik Arena, every Tuesday from 4:30 pm to 7:00 pm, where you can find hand-made and one of a kind items for sale. In the near future there will also be fresh vegetables available. Attendance has been very low and if it does not pick up we will lose the Unique Market Place. Let's not forget the Town's Mega Market and Fair on August 15th, 2015. This year promises to be a lot of fun with the parade, and weekend events including fireworks! Watch for advertizing of Mega Market events. Everyone come out and let's have FUN!





RULES & REGULATIONS

All participants must comply for both the participants and the spectators safety!

Marshalling starts @ 9:00 am along 50 street facing south starting at the Calmar Elementary School. Animal entries are requested to unload in the field in front the Elementary School.

- 1. All entries are to be lined up by 10:30 AM to ensure proper placement in the lineup;
- 2. Distribution of Candy or other treats must be peanut free and wrapped. CANNOT BE THROWN.
- 3. All vehicles must be clean and decorated to a minimum of 80%. Float tow vehicles must be clean and tastefully decorated to complement the rest of the entries. (Exceptions made for antique vehicles.
- 4. Protective equipment, including helmets, must be worn for anyone operating bicycles, motorcycles and offroad vehicles.
- 5. Smoking is NOT permitted on or near floats or motorized entries.
- 6. Entries must continue to the completion of the parade route unless special circumstances arise.
