NOTICE TO TOWN OF CALMAR RESIDENTS

COUNCIL BY-ELECTION

With the resignation of Councillor Lin Rehn on June 26th, 2019, Council is required to hold a By-election to fill the position of Councillor until the next General Election, to be held in October, 2021.

Council has passed a resolution, at the Council Meeting of July 15th, 2019, that the By-election will be held on Monday, September 23rd, 2019 between the hours of 10:00am and 8:00pm.

The Local Authorities Election Act states that Nomination Papers, for persons wanting to run in the By-election, may be filed with the Returning Officer starting on the day following the date on which Town Council set the date for the Election (July 16, 2019) and ending at 12:00 Noon on Nomination Day (August 12, 2019).

Nomination Papers may be obtained at the Town of Calmar Administration Office, located at 4901 – 50th Avenue, Calmar, Alberta or may be downloaded from the Town's Website at www.calmar.ca.

FROM THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT

Well, Canada Day was definitely a “wash” with all the rain. Thank you to the Leduc County Fire Department, Sandra and Nick McIntosh, Councillors Terry Balaban and Krista Gardner, and Camryn Cox who all showed up to help and a HUGE thank you to the 9 brave souls who ventured out in the rain and found us huddled in the Zamboni room at the Mike Karbonik Arena. Earlier in the morning we discussed whether or not to move inside the arena but decided, with the weather forecast we saw, to chance being outdoors so the spray park would be available. Sadly, we chose wrong.

For those who came down to the Town Office and Public Library on the Tuesday following, I hope you enjoyed the Canada Day cake and I thank you for coming down and getting your slice as it would have been a shame to see those cakes go to waste.

Next year, the event will be rain or shine and we hope to do a better job of making the call of whether to go inside or not. In fact, I will say it right here, if there is better than a 30% chance of rain at any point in time between Noon and 3 p.m., we will be indoors. It will still be close enough to the spray park for the kids to use if they wish.

Work on Calmar Days is well under way and, drum roll please, the title for this year’s Movie Under the Stars is.....Dumbo (the live action version from 2018) starting at 9 p.m. Friday night at the ‘corner’ of 45 Ave – 51 St. Bouncies/activities, including the ever popular Thistle Hill Petting Zoo, are booked and the Slo-Pitch tournament has already reached its maximum number of teams. This year the Beer Gardens will feature the band Radio Active Saturday night before the fireworks. This year will see the return of the food trucks to Calmar Days. Hop will be here on the Saturday and Sunday while Smokin’ Barrells (ribs & pulled pork) will be here all 3 days. Big City Dogs will be here as well Saturday evening and the concession at the Mike Karbonik Arena will be open Saturday afternoon. Also returning to Calmar Days is....the Children’s Bike Parade which will once again be a part of the Calmar Day’s Parade that starts the Saturday at 11 a.m. And speaking of the parade, will Calmar Minor Hockey be able to defend their title of Best Overall entry from 2018 or will we be crowning a new champion? The Legion will be bustling with a Show & Shine, BBQ, inside displays and, running on a continuous loop, a video created by the Calmar Prairie Players called “Calmar 0 – 50 in 90 Minutes. Over at the Curling Rink JDRF will once again be running the pancake breakfast and the Ag Society will have their annual Bench Show. Thank you to Lattman for once again agreeing to donate lights and generators and to Direct Line Insurance for donating face painting supplies. And ‘yes’, weather permitting, Saturday night should see fireworks at 11 p.m. Again, if the fireworks cannot be done that night because of weather the resources will be added to the First Night fireworks on New Year’s Eve.

Work continues at the Mike Karbonik Arena regarding the dehumidifiers. The stands are in place and the dehumidifiers have arrived and now we are just waiting for Cimco to do the installation.

Over at the ball diamonds we should soon see some “dugouts”/shelters popping up as the Hi-Way 39 Slo-Pitch League has undertaken the project to get dugouts/shelters for all the diamonds.

The Summer Getaway will be wrapping up later this month and so far things have gone wonderfully. First time coordinator Camryn Cox has acquitted herself very well and her crew of Jaedyn, Megan, Miranda, and Kenda have done a great job. Our numbers are down a little from last year and if one of the reasons I hear is correct, I hope this year’s edition will have shown that reason to be totally off the mark.

The previous few years the Summer Getaway coordinator was Amanda Decker and she did an excellent job, however, the Summer Getaway positions are meant for high school and post-secondary school students to help them get work experience and money for school. This year the conscious decision was made to go back to employing students and I felt that, having spent 3 summers as a group leader, Camryn would have the experience to make the jump to Coordinator. For those who worried the absence of Amanda would mean an inferior product, I hope Camryn has won your trust (on behalf of herself and other students who will one day assume the position of Getaway Coordinator).

Gear up your child for school the right way, with a comprehensive eye exam.

It's that time of year again: summer is winding down, and it's time to get ready for back to school. Most parents' routines involve shopping for new clothing and school supplies so their children are prepared to succeed. What many parents tend to overlook is their child's most important learning tool: their eyes.

"Early comprehensive eye exams are critical to helping children succeed in life" says local optometrist Dr. Sara Starko. "A child's eyes are constantly used in the classroom and at play."

One in four children has a vision-related learning difficulty. A child with a visual problem won't know how the world looks and will assume that what they are seeing is normal. What's more, children with uncorrected vision or eye health problems face many barriers in life: academic, social and athletic.

It can be hard for a child to catch up after struggling and falling behind through the basics of reading, writing, and math. Countless children in Canada are told every day that they have a learning disability when in reality the problem was their vision. A vision screening is not enough.

"A child who sees 20/20 can still have a vision problem," says Dr. Starko. Visual acuity is one aspect of our visual system, but the skills needed for successful reading and learning are much more complex. Vision-related learning problems can cause children to reverse words when writing or copying, confuse the same word in the same sentence, skip lines while reading or read the same line twice. "Optometrists don't just check sight. They check how well the eyes work together and how sight is processed."

Vision problems aren't always obvious (especially if it's a problem with only one eye), and the development of a growing child's eyes doesn't stabilize until age 20. Alberta Health Care covers a comprehensive eye exam every year for children 18 and under. Dr. Starko recommends that babies have their first eye exam between six and nine months.

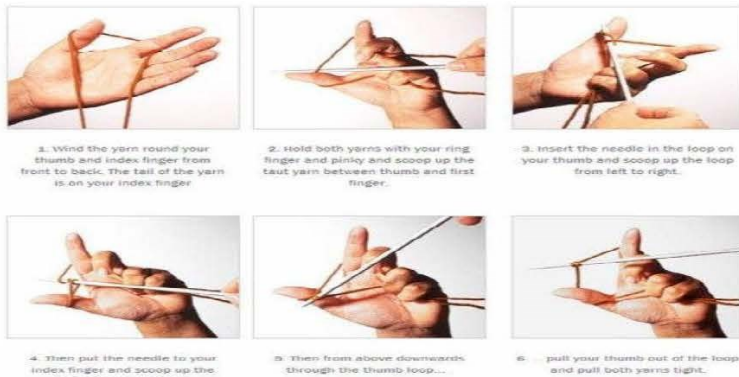

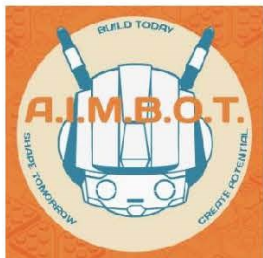

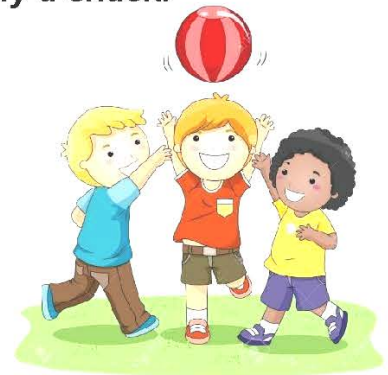
