





- 10. Do not leave items outside that will attract attention that includes garbage from recently purchased big ticket items.
- Leave your outside lights on. This will make the area to your entrance ways visible and deter possible break-ins.
- 8. Place a home security sign at your entrance ways and windows.
- 7. Secure your sliding doors and your windows.
- 6. Do not leave your spare key outside, anywhere.
- 5. Keep tall trees manicured not blocking vision to entry ways and windows.
- Prepare before you go on vacation have someone check daily water flowers and pick up papers.
- 3. Know your neighbors.
- 2. More than 40% of break-ins happen without the use of force lock up.
- 1. If you see or hear suspicious activities, take notice of as many details of the person(s), vehicles, and circumstances that you can. Call the Leduc RCMP.

As you may have heard already, the Town of Calmar has initiated a Crime Prevention Group. Volunteer citizens will be patrolling the Town at all hours of the night and day. With only one Peace Officer on duty, this will lend more eyes and ears to our community.

Let's all do our part in due diligence to protect our friends, neighbours and community!

#### WORKING WITH OUR NEIGHBOURS

Unfortunately, we don't always get along with everyone who is around us. This often leads to petty disputes amongst people which can cause long term headaches over issues that often no one can even trace back. With the increase in things such as social media, technology, etc. We spend less and less time interacting face to face with the people around us.

Talk to any front line officer in law enforcement and they can tell you countless stories of attending to disputes involving neighbours. Some disputes get so heated people sometimes get arrested and charged all over issues involving vehicle parking, location of garbage cans, animals, and other minor issues. People often feel that the best way to resolve an issue with a neighbour is to do something worse to the neighbor to make them "learn a lesson" or to attempt to prove a point.

The reality is, we don't always have to get along with people and no one can force anyone to like anyone else, but life is much easier when we make a conscious effort to get to know our neighbours, interact with the, work together to solve issues and act friendly. As an officer, I sake my head a t full grown adults who are yelling and screaming over fallen leaves on ones property from their neighbor's tree. I challenge everyone to think of the example they set for children when they see adults acting in this manner.

How do we improve our relations with neighbours? First, go talk to them. Make an effort to introduce yourself if you don't know them. If you do know them, keep in touch and ensure all is well. Assuming your neighbour is okay with it, a simple act like shoveling their sidewalk if they are out of town, or keeping an eye on their house can go a long way. If you have a problem with your neighbour attempt to resolve it through polite conversation. Apologizing, even if you don't think you should have to, can go a long way.

Kudos to the Southbridge neighbourhood for recently hosting a neighbourhood BBQ. These events are great ways to meet the people who you live around and can form long lasting bonds that make your quality of living that much better!



#### **Rules & Regulations**

These Regulations are designed for your safety and enjoyment of both participants and spectators. Therefore, all participants must comply with these regulations.

Marshalling starts at 9:00am. The marshalling area is along 50st facing south starting at the Calmar Elementary School. Animal entries to unload in the field in front of the Calmar Elementary School. Parade starts at 11:00am

- 1. All entries are to be lined up by 10:30am, so proper placement in the lineup is ensured
- 2. Distribution of peanut free candy or other edible treats must be wrapped.
- 3. All vehicles must be clean and decorated to a minimum of 80%. Float tow vehicles must be clean and decorated tastefully to compliment the rest of the entry(Exceptions will be made for antique vehicles.)
- 4. Protective equipment, must be worn, including helmets if anyone is operating bicycles, motorcycles, and all off highway vehicles.
- 5. Do not smoke on or near floats or motorized entries.
- 6. Once the parade has started, entries on the parade must continue to completion of the parade route, unless special circumstances provide for removal of an entry.





#### Last Month we shared fun and interesting facts about Canada... In the Spirit of Calmar Days, we would like to share a bit of Calmar's History. As our full story seems to have been lost along the way, we invite our residents to share any further history of our Town they may have or remember.

The first settlers to establish a homestead settled along Conjuring Creek just southwest of present day Calmar in the spring of 1894. They were joined by a number of homesteaders from Kansas. During the period 1897 - 1900 the area continued to grow and was generally referred to as the Conjuring Creek settlement. In 1898 John A. Sangster became the postmaster for Conjuring Creek and the local mailman for the surrounding post office. Mr. Sangster also obtained the first telephone system in the district – the central being in his post office. His settlement was right at what we now call "Spruce Tree Corner".

In 1895, Swedish farmers scouted out and settled on the Northwest side along Conjuring Creek. For a time this area was called the "Swedish Settlement".

Rose Hill, the first school for the district was established in 1897 amid the "Swedish Settlement" and was also used for church services and the occasional concert.

In 1899 C. J. Blomquist became the postmaster for the Swedish Settlement. He named the post office "Calmar: after Kalmar, Sweden, his hometown. This post office was eventually moved to the present day site of Calmar, when a trading centre was located where the range and blind lines crossed.

The closest community to the area was Leduc which was 18 miles of winding trails and creeks and a two-day trip for a wagon and team - if the weather cooperated.

The existence of Calmar seemed to be insured when Robert Telford's road crew built the blind line right through the community.

When CPR established its railway many small communities moved. They wanted Calmar to move 1/2 mile south of it's current location. Calmar did not budge! CPR tried to rename our community to Calverly - our forefather's refused to accept this and eventually CPR gave in to them and named the siding and station, Calmar



(Where the site of four graineries were erected).

Calmar started with a small frame building erected by a locally organized Farmers' Co-operative hoping to serve themselves and save in the purchase of supplies. The venture eventually failed and the building was taken over by young man by the name of Joe Hoffman. This gave Calmar the boost it needed! A small business run by C.P. Samuels, a Blacksmith, Mr. Peterson and Palm

Dairy Creamery were the first businesses following Hoffman's.

In 1945 there were several businesses along the south side of main street that were destroyed by fire.

By 1956, there were 23 business located along Calmar's main street and a population of almost 800. Today, there are 31 businesses along main street and a population of 2101.

In 1949 Calmar was incorporated as a Village and only 5 short years later, in 1954, received its "Town" status.

### Alberta ZIRKA Ukrainian Performers Celebrating almost 40 years of culture, artistry and Ukrainian Dance

The Alberta Zirka Ukrainian Performers are excited to welcome, nationally acclaimed director and choreographer, Dave Ganert to the organization. Mr. Ganert returns to Zirka from working with the world renowned Ukrainian Shumka Dancers. Dave performed in over 600 shows locally, nationally and around the world. One performance highlight was in the touring production of *A Royal Christmas* performing alongside Julie Andrews, Christopher Plummer, and Charlotte Church, with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra of London, Westminster Choir, the Kiev Ballet, and artists from the Bolshoi, Royal Ballet of London, and the Royal Winnipeg Ballet.

Dave spent 10 years dancing with Zirka before joining Shumka in 1991. In Dave's 23 years with Shumka, he grew from becoming a principal dancer with the company to choreographing and directing. He served as Resident Choreographer for 13 years, Associate Artistic Director for 7 years and as Artistic Director for the past 6 years retiring from the group in November 2013. His artistic work has gained much recognition and numerous scholarships and awards throughout Canada including Queen Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee Medal honoring significant contributions and achievements by a Canadian. Mr. Ganert has instructed and adjudicated over 5,000 students across Canada, United States, Ukraine and China. One of his favorite collaborative works came from working with Jean-Marc Gé néeux, of So you Think You Can Dance Canada, in which they created a tribute piece recognizing the struggle and celebrating the triumph of people living with Multiple Sclerosis.

Throughout all of Dave's successes he remained close to the Zirka family in heart and spirit and now returns to the Zirka organization as the new Director and Principal. Zirka will now be offering a professional dance program following a syllabus of Ukrainian dance study, an innovative Pre-Beginner and Beginner Program starting at age 3 and an exciting vision for Zirka as they approach their 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary next dance season. A beautiful artistic mural celebrating this achievement will soon be scene at Zirka's studios 4920-50<sup>th</sup> avenue, Calmar.
