
Wrapping Game



WWI Christmas Truce - 1914



This Christmas marks the 100th Anniversary of The Christmas
Truce. The Christmas Truce was a series of widespread, unofficial ceasefires that took place along the Western Front around
Christmas 1914, during World War I. Throughout the week leading up to Christmas, parties of German and British soldiers began to exchange seasonal greetings and songs between their trenches; on occasion, the tension was reduced to the point that individuals would walk across to talk to their opposite numbers

bearing gifts. On Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, many soldiers from both sides and, to a lesser degree, from French units, independently ventured into "no mans land" where they mingled, exchanging food and souvenirs. As well as joint burial ceremonies, several meetings ended in carol-singing. Troops from both sides were also friendly enough to play games of football with one another.

In honour of not only the 100th Anniversary of the first Christmas Truce, but all the ones that have followed throughout the last century and the ones before it.

Tiwas the night before Christmas and all through the land

Not a soldier was stirring, no gun in their hand.

When all of the sudden through the quiet flecks of light,

The troops all started singing "Silent Night".

It started with the Germans and then all those who could hear

Came out of their trenches to join in, with no fear

Together they sang Christmas carols, exchanging gifts and good tidings

In the middle of the war, Peace on Earth was their finding.

They shared pictures of family and a friendly football game

Forgetting for a moment their task to kill and maim.

Holding ceremonies for the fallen in no man's land together,

Wishing for peace but knowing that the war was not over.

Being brave does not always mean you have to stand and fight,

These soldiers showed more courage standing together,

singing "Silent Night".

World AIDS Day: A global discussion

There are over 34.2 million people currently living with HIV around the globe. A global pandemic, HIV has claimed more than 25 million lives over the past three decades.

On December 1 of each year, the world celebrates World AIDS Day – a day devoted to increasing awareness of HIV and AIDS issues globally.

Targeting zero

"Getting to Zero" is the slogan linked to World AIDS Day and the global fight against HIV and AIDS. It symbolizes the world's commitment in achieving the following three targets: zero new HIV infections, zero discrimination, and zero AIDS-related deaths.

Though numbers from all categories remain high, a sense of optimism surrounds the battle against HIV and AIDS. With a greater perception of the disease and an improved awareness, the world isn't losing sight of the Millennium Development Goal of halting HIV and AIDS and beginning to reverse the spread by 2015





December 3 is the annual International Day of Persons with Disabilities and aims to promote an understanding of disability issues and mobilize support for the rights, dignity and well-being of persons with disabilities – including children. It also celebrates the benefits for the whole society when persons with disabilities are included in every aspect of life.

Canada agreed to provide for the full human rights of children with disabilities to live life in dignity and reach their fullest potential when it signed the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child in 1989. This Convention was the first international human rights treaty to include an explicit focus on disability. The Convention provides both universal protection of the rights of children with disabilities and special attention to the needs of children with disabilities in realizing those universal rights.

Since then, Canada has made progress in fulfilling the rights of children with disabilities including improving access to education, mental health services and financial supports for families. Yet there is evidence of continuing discrimination against children with disabilities that impacts their dignity, survival, development to fullest potential and inclusion in social life – often at great human and financial cost to their families, and to the rest of society.



An article on the effects of Drinking and Driving tells one mother's heartbreaking story of how she lost her son to drinking and driving.





The Universal Declaration of Human Rights was drafted between January 1947 and December 1948. It aimed to form a basis for human rights all over the world and represented a significant change of direction from events during World War II and the continuing colonialism that was rife in the world at the time. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights is considered the most translated document in modern history. It is available in more than 360 languages and new translations are still being added.

The UN General Assembly adopted and proclaimed the Universal Declaration of Human Rights at the Palais de Chaillot in Paris, France, on the December 10, 1948. All states and interested organizations were invited to mark December 10 as Human Rights Day at a UN meeting on December 4, 1950. It was first observed on December 10 that year and has been observed each year on the same date. Each year Human Rights Day has a theme. Some of these themes have focused on people knowing their human rights or the importance of human rights education.
