



Fire Hall Corner

This month we thought it would be important to share some information about our members and the number of calls we respond to. Currently we have 25 "Paid On-Call" members. These members are not full time employees. They are volunteers who receive a small stipend for attending incidents and training. All other functions and public events, the members are volunteering their time and are not being compensated. The Fire Chief although full time, does not spend the whole time dealing with Fire Department matters. He is also responsible for the Town's Occupational Health and Safety program, as well as Disaster Services. The Department currently has a waiting list, since there is not sufficient room for anymore members in our current building.

The Fire Department responds to a wide variety of incidents. Our current Level of Service Policy, permits the Fire Department to attend various types of Fires, Motor Vehicle Collisions / Rescue, Medical Response, Investigative / Complaints, Fire Prevention/Awareness and Mutual Aid. Below is review of the Departments statistics with regards incident response. As you can see the numbers are only getting bigger.

2015 – (As of November 1) 98 Incident Responses

2014 – 134 Incident Responses

2013 – 98 Incident Responses

2012 – 68 Incident Responses

2011 – 72 Incident Responses
