

# PEACE OFFICER CORNER

Good Day .....

I would first like to wish a Happy New Year to the citizens of Calmar.....

It was a tough 2020. My feeling is that 2021 is going to be a tough one as well. We all want to go back to our own version of a normal life, but unfortunately that will not happen for a while. I have had many conversations with both sides, those who believe in COVID and those that do not. I would like to point out the following: it does not matter either way. I like to speak to indisputable facts, not versions of one sides facts or the other sides. We can put a different name on COVID, and it wouldn't matter. People are dying from the flu, and people are dying from COVID, that is an undisputed fact. It's also an undisputed fact that our hospitals are being overworked, and overrun, by what some call the flu or others call COVID. Again, does it matter what it is called? The facts are hospitals are overrun. So, if we are told to wear a mask to help lighten the hospital case load, does it matter what name we put to the reason the hospitals are overrun? It has got to the point that those who chose to disobey the restrictions and mask wearing, have increased the case load to the point that the Stollery Hospital has had to double up some of their child patients to make room for more COVID patients. This means parents cannot stay and comfort their kids because there is no room for them. That is what is really upsetting. I am all for free speech and having our own opinions and I will support anyone who disagrees with my point of view. I will also support anyone who disagrees with the government's point of view. But I will not support a person's choice, opinion, or view that causes the removal of a sick child because they feel wearing a mask is a sign of government control or goes against their right of freedom. My response to those two positions is simple, right of life supersedes right of freedom or the feeling of government control.

How selfish have we become that compassion has left some of us? And what about the situation if a medical emergency or accident occurs in your family, but due to an overrun health care facility, that family member cannot be attended to in a timely manner. I am tired of the restrictions; I have not been able to visit my family members for a very long time. And on top of that, the government has required me to enforce these restrictions on those who chose to feel they do not apply to them.

Calmar is a great community that I have come to enjoy being a part of. The best part of my day comes while crossing the kids at school and hearing their stories or seeing their excited faces for what they got for Christmas, or what exciting things are going on in their lives. And to think that one of them may need medical attention that may not be available because of a selfish adult decision, frankly, upsets me. If an adult chooses to put their life at risk, that is their choice. I will not allow any adult to put a Calmar child's life, or Calmar senior's life in danger. So, watch for my truck, watch for me, because I have a \$1,000 ticket ready to hand you if you attempt to put the life of a child or senior at risk by choosing to not wear a mask. How would you or your spouse/partner react when your selfishness cost the family \$1,000, during a time when some may only be getting the CERB payment.

One last thing, dog barking complaints are way up, and they should be the easiest to resolve. Have respect for your neighbours and keep your dogs under control. If you find you cannot care for your dog, let me know and I can arrange for a rescue to find it a good home.

Yes, I too am upset, frustrated, tired, and want a return to normal, but that's not going to happen anytime soon so let's try and be understanding and compassionate to those who are at risk.

# **2021 Municipal Election Newsletter**

# January 15,2021

October 18th, 2021 brings us to another round of General Municipal Elections, across Alberta, for the positions of Mayors, Reeves, Aldermen and Councilors for local jurisdictions. In Calmar, residents will elect a Mayor and four Councilors. Nomination forms will be placed shortly on the Calmar website or will be available in at the Town Administration Building located at 4901 – 50<sup>th</sup> Avenue. All persons wishing to file a nomination paper with the Returning Officer, must also file an Application for Registration of Notice of Intent to Become a Candidate for Municipal Office, which is a declaration regarding campaign financing.

In 2019 and again in 2020, the Local Authorities Election Act was changed by the Province of Alberta. One of the major changes is that any eligible person may file a nomination with the Returning Officer at any time during regular business hours between January 2, 2021 and 12:00 Noon on Nomination day which is four (4) weeks prior to Election day which will be September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021. The 2-hour restriction (10am to 12am Noon) on Nomination Day only, for filing nomination papers, has been eliminated. With COVID-19, the Administration Office business office hours are restricted at present. Watch the Town's website at <a href="www.calmar.ca">www.calmar.ca</a> for any changes in business hours.

Election Day will be Monday, October 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and voting is planned to take place between the hours of 10:00am and 8:00pm at a Voting Station, the location of which is to be determined due to Covid-19 and social distancing restrictions. Watch for further information in this regard. For those unable to vote on Election Day, an Advance Vote is proposed to take place on Saturday, October 9<sup>th</sup>, 2021 between the hours of 1:00pm and 4:00pm, again at a Voting Station location to be determined.

### **Property Taxes**

The Town offers a penalty free payment plan specially for Tax Accounts. (TIPS)

You can sign up anytime through out the year! (You will need to pay up front for the months that have already passed, to stay caught up).
