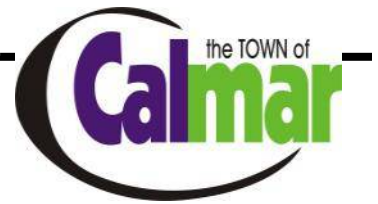

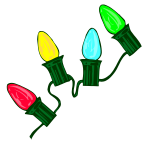

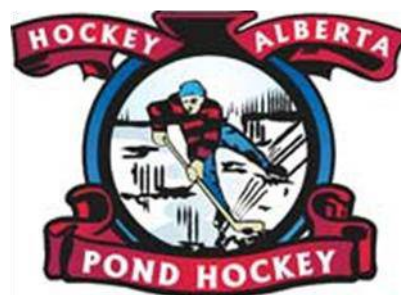

Notice to Town of Calmar Residents Water bills

Effective January 1st, 2013, the Capital Region South west Water Service Commission has increased the price of water, purchased by the Town of Calmar by 10.25%. This increase necessitates an increase in the bi-monthly flat rate, charged for water on residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, service clubs and seniors housing accounts, starting with the January/February 2013 billing. The average increase on a bi-monthly bill will amount to \$3.00. Sanitary sewer and garbage rates will remain unchanged for 2013.
