Good day Citizens of Calmar....

I would like to thank the overwhelming majority of the residence who have kept their sidewalks clean and made walking through out our town easier. To the few who have allowed their sidewalks to build up ice and snow, as I stated in my last edition, a \$100.00 fine will be issued. If the sidewalk is still not clear, the town will come in and clear it with the cost going to the occupant of the home or property owner as a debt owing to the Town. I appreciate all those who have called concerning this issue and can assure you all that even if the process does require time to rectify, I will be working as quickly as possible to keep all our sidewalks clear. Developers, Business, and Lot owners are also responsible to keep their front sidewalks clear of snow and ice.

Don't forget that road clearing season is coming up and to obey our Public Works "No Parking" sign during these clearing times. Tow trucks will be ordered and in town to remove all vehicles not following the parking ban hours. All towing related costs will go to the registered owner of the vehicle located in the parking ban areas.

Head lights will continue to be a focus as with the shorter daylight hours vehicle headlights become even more important for road and pedestrian safety.

I have seen quite a few unregistered vehicles on the roads, parked and driving. I will be issuing either a "Display expired plate" ticket, or "Drive/park unregistered vehicle on a roadway" ticket. A vehicle that is parked or driven on any public roadway requires registration and insurance.

We are now entering the Christmas season and it's my hope we all enjoy this party season. PLEASE, if you are going to have drinks, do not drive. The risk of losing your life or taking the life of another is not worth it. It would be life changing to your friends and family as well as to the victim's family and friends. Town of Calmar Finance Department Report

I am pleased to report that 2017 will be a very successful year financially for the Town. The 2017 Operating budget was approved with only a 2.5% increase in Municipal taxation after two consecutive years of a 0% increase for 2015 and 2016. Even with the hardships brought on with the economy, the Town was still able to achieve a collection rate of 88.5%. It appears that the Town will have an operating surplus for 2017 which we will recommend to Town Council to transfer to reserves for use on Capital projects in 2018 to eliminate the requirement to debenture borrow to finance anticipated projects.

In regard to 2017 Capital projects, the entire budget for projects of \$2.5 Million, the largest of which was a \$1 Million upgrade to the Mike Karbonik Arena, was totally financed by a Federal 150 Grant, Provincial Grants, Leduc County contributions and the use of Town reserves. There was no necessity for the Town to debenture borrow to finance any portion of its share of Capital expenditures.

We, in the Finance Department, wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year in 2018.

Director of Operations/Land Development Corner

D would like to wish everyone all the best in the holiday season, and a safe and Happy New Year.

We were very excited to be successful with receiving the Canada 150 Grant funding to help with the approximately 1 million dollar upgrade to the Mike Karbonik Arena. Following a facility study it was determined that the Ice Plant, and Ice Plant/Zamboni room were at the end of their life expectancy. Total cost for this upgrade was approx. 1.1 million dollars, funding for the project was ½ grant funding, ¼ Leduc County, and ¼ Town of Calmar (reserves).

Calmar was also successful in receiving the TAME Grant which allowed for all lighting in the Arena to be upgraded to LED, which will substantially lower electricity cost and improve lighting.

Calmar is also looking into possibly another round of Grant funding to assist with upgrades to the front foyer of the facility to accommodate more dressing rooms, perhaps a fitness center and larger lobby area.

The Arena/Curling Rink parking lot also received a new lift of asphalt.

That was the up, then there was the down, the Refrigeration Plant manufacturer in Toronto was back logged with orders this year and although the Ice Plant was ordered in May it did not arrive until October, thus delaying the opening by approx. 6 weeks.

The Town of Calmar is also in the early planning stages of the Zolner Park, located just south of the existing Ball Diamonds, this area is slated to house soccer fields, additional ball diamonds, perhaps some camping stalls, change rooms etc.

Town of Calmar is also working with the Library Board to allow for a wheel chair accessible foyer to be added to the front entrance of the Library in 2018.

Public Works also had a busy year with completing the Water Reservoir Upgrade. This upgrade nearly doubled the water capacity of the Town ensuring Fire Control Quantities can be guaranteed. Hopefully we will not need to shut down the spray park this year on hot days and this ensures the Town of Calmar is in compliance with all federal and provincial regulations.

Upgrades to the Westview Area of Town has begun with the completion of 52 Street upgrades including new sidewalks and a fresh lift of asphalt. Plans are to move forward in the area, with potential for upgrades to begin on Parkview Crescent as early as 2018, if funding permits.

We were unfortunate, like many others this year to be broken into at our Public Works yard, we lost a 2014 Ford pickup, laptop, a couple of iPads, and small tools. We were lucky enough to get a \$1500.00 metal detector recovered.

It is nice to see that housing starts are on the rise once again, we have 8 new home starts in Southbridge, A 15 unit condo complex, a 5Plex, as well as an 8Plex planned for construction in 2018.

It is also pleasing to see the new Doctors Office coming up next to the Library, it is a very nice addition to our main street. Development is still in the works for the former Calmar Hotel Site, but is also planned for 2018.

Reminders:

- Sump pump hoses are to discharge onto property, not to run across sidewalks causing ice
- If you use the rubber or other curb ramps to get into your driveway have them removed for the winter to allow Public Works Staff to remove snow from your street without causing damage
- Please ensure vehicles are removed from streets on snow removal days, every attempt will be made to give at least 24 hour notice when crews will be in your area.
- Please ensure that children do not play on storm water retention ponds, Ice in these ponds can be very unstable, especially this year with the unusually warm weather



Pursuant to the Tax Recovery process in the Municipal Government Act, the single family residence, **located at #5202 – 52nd Street**, was offered for sale, at a price of \$222,000.00, at a Public Auction held on July 14th, 2017. The property was not sold at the Auction and the Town of Calmar has taken title to the property. The Town now rents the property to the previous owner.

Pursuant to further processes in the Municipal Government Act, the property may now be sold by private sale with no further notice to the previous owner. A sale may be initiated by a person or persons by presenting a bona fide offer, along with a 10% deposit, based on the offer, to the Town Council of the Town of Calmar. Council may entertain any offer that is reasonably close to fair market value.

Mayor's Corner

Happy New Year Everyone! 2017 has come to an end and a New Year is about to begin. With that in mind, I feel it is important to discuss the year that has been, and our vision for the year to come.

The last year has come with some changes, as will the one to follow. In October 2017, your voice was heard and a new Council was elected. I would like to thank each and every one of you again for your vote of confidence in electing me to lead the town. It has been an honor and privilege to serve as your Mayor for the last three years. In the past few years I have tried my very best to keep the lines of communication open and transparency in what Council is doing. This is something I intend to continue through 2018 and beyond.

Community Policing continues to be a critical issue. In the spirit of open communication, once the figures for Capital costs have been gathered, we will have an open house to divulge those figures so you can advise Council which service you want. The options are; Leduc R.C.M.P. enhanced Service or a Calmar Police Force. I'd like to assure you that your feedback is important in deciding our direction for community policing.

There's some safety concerns that Council heard while going door to door. The major one was crosswalks and crosswalk lights at two locations on Highway 39. Money is being budgeted in 2018 to install these needed crossings and signals.

The Country and Province have seen a downturn in the economy in the last few years, but the news for Calmar remains positive. We continue to see some new housing and a new Doctor's office being built. The removal of the damaged building on the corner of 50th Street and 50th Avenue has occurred and will allow for a new building to be built at that location. In addition to the new growth, street and sidewalk upgrades were completed on 52nd Street between 50th and 52nd Avenue. We have a new ice plant in the Mike Karbonik Arena that should give our community another 40 years of winter recreation. We have purchased land to expand the public works yard and plan on building a new public works building. All services remain at the same level as in the past. I am happy to report that all of this was accomplished with a 2.5 percent municipal tax increase for 2017. One of the lowest tax increases in the area! Everyone is welcome to come out and listen to the 2018 budget talks in Council chambers in January 2018.

In 2017, Council and Town Administration's primary focus was to upgrade and rebuild the infrastructure to support our future growth. We completed the expansion of the water reservoir to supply more water than was available to the town. Rebuilding major town buildings is another large project we intend to begin in the future. Our town is growing and that requires taking steps to support our future needs.

Council is presently working with Axia. A company that could supply high speed fiber optic internet service to our community. Four things that businesses are looking for in a community before they locate are; water supply, sewer, power supply, and high-speed internet. We have three of the four. We just need the high-speed internet to complete the requirements needed to attract new business to our community.

Please sign up at the Town Office to show your interest for high-speed fiber optic internet service. If we can show that one-third of the community is interested, Axia will look at supplying infrastructure and service to Calmar.




