Mayor's Corner

Happy New Year Everyone! As 2019 comes to an end and 2020 comes in with a roar it is that time again to review what was and look forward to what is to come.

In the past few years, I have tried my best to keep the lines of communication open and have transparency in what Council is doing. This is something I intend to continue through 2020 and beyond.

In October we were excited to welcome former Councilor and Mayor, Don Faulkner back to Council. Don brings a great deal of experience to this role and we all look forward to working with him.

Rural Policing continues to be a critical issue and in 2020 the Provincial Government will be charging communities under a population of 5,000 a fee for Policing Services. At present, communities with a population of under 5,000 do not pay for RCMP services.

At the time of this writing, we do not know how much the Town of Calmar will have to pay the Provincial Government for these services. This fact begs the question, do we consider the option of Leduc RCMP enhanced services or do we continue to look at the possibility of starting a Calmar Police Force?

I assure all residents of the Town of Calmar that your feedback is of the utmost importance to Council and Administration when deciding our direction for community policing. Once the information for all options has been gathered, we will have an Open House to get your input on this very important matter.

Our Province has seen a huge downturn in the economy in the last few years, but the news for Calmar remains positive. We continue to see a few new housing startups. In addition to the new growth, street and sidewalk upgrades were completed on Parkview Crescent. Our service levels in Town have remained relatively unchanged as in the past, and I am happy to report that all of this was accomplished with an average 1.5% municipal tax increase per year from 2010 to 2019. Calmar boasts one of the lowest tax increases per year in our area! In 2019, Council and Town Administration's primary focus was to upgrade and rebuild the infrastructure to support our future growth. The new Public Works Shop is another large project we began in 2019. Our Town is growing and that requires taking steps to support our future needs.

Council is presently working with Big WIFI Internet services. They are a company that supplies high speed internet services to communities such as Calmar. Four things that business is looking for in a community before they locate are; water supply, sewer, power supply and high-speed internet. We have three of the four. We just need the high-speed internet to complete the requirements needed to attract new business to our community.

With that said, Calmar is in a very attractive position and place for business and families to come home to. This is a very positive time to live and do business in Calmar. I believe we are on the cusp of great growth that other communities around us have enjoyed in the past. So here's to 2020 and the start of something big in this new decade!

Finance Department Fourth Quarter Report

Well, the year is quickly coming to an end. The 2020 Operating and Capital budget process is underway with the first Council/Departmental budget meeting held on December 5th. We received news from the Province of Alberta that, starting in 2021, every municipality with a population of under 5,000 persons and rural Municipal Districts and Counties will have to start paying for RCMP services. The Town of Calmar, in 2021, will be contributing approximately **\$40,000 to the Province** for policing which relates to a 1.5% increase in municipal taxes alone for this new levy. This amount increases to approximately \$60,000 in 2022 (a further 0.75% increase in taxes), to approximately \$81,000 in 2023 (a further 0.75% increase in taxes), to a maximum of \$121,000 in 2024 and future years (a further 1.5% increase in taxes).

Administration is gearing up for the 2019 year-end and preparing for the arrival of the Town's Auditors on Feb. 3rd, 2020 to complete the 2019 Financial Statements.

From all the Town staff in the Finance Department, have a safe and Very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Happily, the Seniors Centre/Legion sold some more tickets for their Playhouse Raffle.

Ideas are being bounced around to try and make our craft fair bigger and better so stay tuned for more news – especially if the event gets moved to an earlier date as is being considered. Thank you to Black Gold School Division for providing the space and to Donna Staudinger for all of her help and assistance. Thanks also to the Town's Public Works for setting up and taking down and also to Coffee, Pucks, & Poutine for operating the concession.

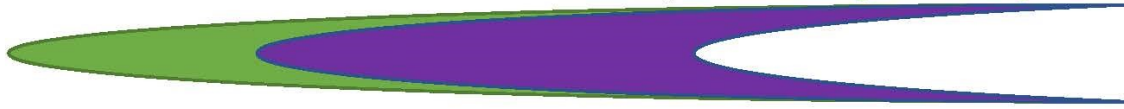
