Effective January 1, 2016, the Capital Region Southwest Water Service Commission has increased the price of water purchased by the Town of Calmar by 11.6%. This increase necessitates an increase to the bimonthly charge for water on all residential/ commercial Accounts. This increase will be reflected on the January/February, 2016 billing. The flate rate of water will increase by \$5.60.



MAYOR'S CORNER

2015 is coming to an end and a new year is about to begin. With that in mind, I feel it important to discuss the year that has been, and our vision for the year to come. The last year has come with some changes, as will the one to follow. In early 2015, your voice was heard and the faces of two members of Council and Mayor were changed. I would like to thank each and every one of you again for your vote of confidence in leading the town. It has been a distinct privilege to serve as your Mayor for the last ten months. In the past year I have tried my very best to keep the lines of communication open and transparent. This is something I intend to continue through 2016 and beyond.

Community Policing was, and will continue to be an important issue. In the spirit of open communication, the Leduc R.C.M.P. and Council have created a survey for residents to voice their concerns. I'd like to assure you that your feedback is important in deciding our direction for community policing and as such we have done our best to make this survey accessible to all residents. The survey can be filled out online or picked up at the Town Office. Please help us make a difference and voice your opinions when the time comes.

The Country and Province have seen a downturn in the economy in the last year, but the news for Calmar remains positive. We continue to see some new housing starts, a new water line was ran south to the industrial park and a new intersection on Highway 39 was completed this year. The completion of this intersection has allowed thirty two (32) acres of new industrial land to be available for sale. In addition to the new growth, a water line, sewer, street and sidewalk upgrade was completed on 46th avenue between 50th and 51st street. I am happy to report that all of this was accomplished with a zero percent municipal tax increase for 2015. If you are interested in hearing what is in the 2016 Town budget please feel free to come out and listen to the budget talks at the council chambers in January.

In 2016, Council and Town Administration's primary focus will be the upgrading and rebuilding of infrastructure to support our future growth. We are planning to expand the water reservoir to supply more water than is currently available. Rebuilding and renovating major town buildings is another large project we intend to begin in 2016. There are currently two groups fund raising and applying for grants to build a new Fire Hall and renovate the Mike Karbonik Arena. Our Town is growing and that requires taking steps to support our future needs. Our primary focus is the need for a new protective services building. The present one was built originally in the 1950's, and has since been renovated and expanded twice. Simply put it has been outgrown and there is the requirement for a new facility. Once funding is secured for building a new protective services facility we will begin planning more upgrades. Being a mainstay in the community, our skating arena will also be in need of renovations to be ready for continued and growing use. We intend to begin the process of securing funding and planning for it's upgrade in the new year as well.

Town of Calmar Residents Survey Questionnaire

The Town of Calmar is currently considering more police presence for the residents in the Town of Calmar.

The Town is looking at three (3) options:

Option 1. 2nd Community Peace Officer

The addition of a second Community Peace Officer (CPO). This second CPO would provide the citizens of Calmar an additional 40 hours per week of Police presence. This 2nd CPO would have the same Peace Officer Appointment as the current CPO we have. The Peace Officer Appointment obtained now includes the following legislations:

Animal Protection Act
Dangerous Dogs Act
Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act (Part 9, Division 2)
Gaming and Liquor Act
Petty Trespass Act
Provincial Offences Procedure Act
Trespass to Premises Act
Tobacco and Smoking Reduction Act
Traffic Safety Act

All criminal matters that may arise, CPO (s) would still have to contact the R.C.M.P for their assistance to the Town of Calmar.

Costs associated with employing a 2nd Community Peace Officer for the Town – The Town's payroll department would have an additional annual cost of approximately \$64,000-\$70,000 (depending on experience) to the rate payers of the Town of Calmar. This would include wages and benefits. There may be an additional cost for a 2nd CPO vehicle.

Option 2. Enhanced RCMP Officer

There would be a lot of flexibility with an Enhanced RCMP position that the Leduc RCMP Detachment would work on with the Town of Calmar. The position itself; however, would report to the Operations NCO at the Leduc Detachment. This keeps politics separate from operations. What it would be though is a position dedicated to Calmar at 40 hrs. per week and the Leduc Detachment could work out a schedule to work with the Town's CPO position. The RCMP Detachment would foresee the position being

Supervised out of Leduc, starting and ending shift in Leduc, and giving their member a laptop to work out of the Town office at Calmar, except when dealing with prisoners, etc.

Costs associated with employing an Enhanced RCMP Officer – If the Town decides to employ an Enhanced RCMP Officer, the rate payers are looking at approximately \$160,000 (including all benefits and wages) for 40 hours a week service provided by the Enhanced Peace Officer. This includes a RCMP vehicle and office equipment such as a laptop, office supplies etc. If approved, the \$160,000 would be a 70% - 30% split. 70% to the Town of Calmar and 30% to the Province. This would mean an estimated cost of about \$112,000 to the Town of Calmar. Again, both the Town of Calmar and the Province of Alberta would have to agree on this.

Option 3. Neither one at this time

What does all this mean for our tax payers?

The Town does not anticipate much of an increase in taxes except the 2.5% that was reflected in the 2015-2017 budget amounts. That means that any additional RCMP or CPO costs are going to increase that 2.5% over and above.

RCMP Policing Priorities

The RCMP is committed to preserving the peace, upholding the law and providing quality service in partnership with the communities it serves. The purpose of this brief, **seven-question survey** is to ensure the public has a say in what the RCMP priorities are for the region.

Each year, RCMP from the Leduc and Thorsby/Breton detachments establish policing priorities to ensure that, in addition to responding to calls for service, members focus on the policing issues identified by the public as being the most important. These priorities are determined based on the feedback the RCMP receives from the municipalities and communities they serve.

Leduc County and the City of Leduc have partnered with the RCMP to conduct this brief survey to ensure that RCMP priorities align with those of the public. Information collected from this survey will be reviewed and considered by RCMP, Leduc County council, City of Leduc council and policing committees in the region.
