

DID YOU KNOW...

In 1972 Mayor Neil McKerracher approached the Edmonton Public Library asking them to donate old and discarded books to the Town of Calmar. That started the process of collecting approximately 200 books a week and so began the first Calmar Public Library housed in the Town Hall.

 For the Spring Clean Up the Town picked up 38 dump truck loads of dry waste, 5 dump truck loads of metals and a 1 ton load of electronics and drove a total of 2,440 km between the three dump trucks.

Finance Department Second Quarter Report

Well, we are nearing the end of June and half of the Town's fiscal year is over.

I want to remind residents that a copy of the 2018 Financial Statements and the approved 2019 Operating and Capital Budgets are posted on the Town's website at <u>www.calmar.ca</u> or you can obtain a copy at the front desk at the Town Office. If you have questions in regards to the Financial Statements and/or Budgets, do not hesitate to call me at 780-985-3604 ext. 226 or email me at <u>mstorey@calmar.ca</u>.

The 2019 Combined Assessment and Tax Notices were mailed on May 10th, 2019 and just a reminder that taxes, except for those property owners that are on the monthly Tax Installment Plan, are payable by June 30th to avoid a late payment penalty. A further reminder that, any resident wishing to file a 2019 property assessment complaint, the deadline for receipt by the Town of the complaint form, which was included with your tax notice, and applicable filing fee, is 4:30 pm on July 22nd, 2019.

In July, we will begin preparation of the next 3 year Operating Budget for 2020-2022 and a 5 year Capital Budget for 2020-2024 for presentation to Town Council in November.



FROM THE ROECROEATION DEPAROTMENT

June saw us try a couple of new events for the Town. First, on the 8th we had our 1st Annual Farmers' Day Pancake Breakfast at the Mike Karbonik Arena (MKA). 55 people, including our MLA Mark Smith, came out for free pancakes and sausages. Thanks to Sandra, Tom, & Nick McIntosh, Councilors Keith Froese and Krista Gardner, Mayor Wally Yachimetz, Rhonda Kanis, Patricia Ashley, and Chris Feist for helping with everything from setting up to cooking and serving, to cleaning up. Thanks also to the crew of Public Works for setting up the tables and chairs and the BBQ. The turnout was less than we expected but it was a busy weekend with not the best weather and it was the first kick at the cat so hopefully we will see more people in 2020!

We also tried to hold the Fathers' Day Pentathlon on the 15th but unfortunately we only had two entrants and then both had to pull out. We will try this again in 2020 and hopefully we will finally get this event off the ground!

As you read this, the dehumidifiers should be installed at the MKA! Originally they were supposed to have been installed in 2018 but then we had to replace the condenser. We can operate without the dehumidifiers – we can't without a condenser. Now that the dehumidifiers are in, it will be easier to install ice and the quality of ice should also be improved, and spectators and users should also find it a bit more comfortable with the drier air.

Still to come at the MKA is a new trophy case for Minor Hockey. The day after the ice season ended back in March, the previous Minor Hockey trophy case came crashing down. The new trophy case has been ordered and should be installed before the end of August, after the Getaway has wrapped up for the summer.

Finally, back in 1984 the Town and the County of Leduc Board of Education signed a Joint Use Agreement (JUA) that would allow the schools access to Town recreation facilities and the community access to school facilities. As one would expect, after 34 years there would be some changes – the biggest one being that the County of Leduc Board of Education no longer exists.

Back in June the Town and Black Gold School Division finally sat down to review the JUA and I am happy to inform the community that both parties are quite satisfied with how things have worked over the years and that the only changes to be made are due to our society today.

So if a not-for-profit community group wishes to use either Calmar Elementary School or Calmar Secondary School, it can go 1 of 2 ways. If the group's use/activity is endorsed by the Town and the group has the proper insurance coverage (also naming the Town and Black Gold as additional named insureds) then the facility use is free if it does not involve any additional work time for school staff (i.e. the custodian). If any additional staff time is required then the group will be invoiced for that time. If the group's use is not endorsed by the Town or if they do not have the proper insurance coverage, then there will be a rental fee.

Hope to see a lot of you on Canada Day at Engberg Park from Noon to 3. Don't forget we will be serving hot dogs (maximum of 2 per person) and cake!
