FROM THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT

2 people actually contacted me directly regarding the question of what should "Zolner" Park feature for facilities but a lot of people did comment on the Calmar Crime Watch page. Probably 99% of all comments focused on 1 or the other of the following: campgrounds or dog park. Without getting into things too deeply here, I can say that the Town is seriously looking at campgrounds with a dump station and (separately) a dog park but is not considering the "Zolner" Park area for either. As it stands, the Recreation Board is recommending a 4th ball diamond and 2 soccer fields with additional patron parking and a bbq/picnic area for tournament use.

A couple of comments received mentioned there are no basketball courts in town. Well, good news for these bball enthusiasts – there are courts over at Westview Park at 52 Street – 52 Avenue. BUT here's the rub. It has been brought to my attention that sometimes when bballers go to shoot some hoops, sometimes they can't get on because there are 4 pickleball courts on the basketball court and there have been pickleball players on there. Now, I could follow in the words of a Canadian rock band and put up a sign there but let's see if we can avoid the clutter by allowing users to self-police themselves. The simple truth is the basketball courts were built first and, obviously, for basketball. Because of this, basketball should take precedence. That said, it appears an arrangement seems to have been made that pickleball would run the months of July and August on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:30 – 8:30 p.m. So to honour the commitment to pickleball my predecessor made, let's respect the arrangement.

However, If pickleballers are using the courts at times other than 6:30 – 8:30 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays during July and August and some people show up to play basketball, the pickleballers should vacate the courts (in a timely fashion – after all, if you are in a middle of a game you should be able to finish it) to allow basketball to happen. If pickleballers and bballers cannot self-regulate the use of the courts themselves, then I will have no choice but to put up a sign outlining what days and times each activity can use the courts – please don't make me do this.

On Saturday June 8th the Recreation Board invites everyone down to the Mike Karbonik Arena for a pancake breakfast to recognize the many contributions of the hardworking farmer to our community. For those dedicated harvesters of the earth, we will even have special little token of our appreciation (besides breakfast).

The following Saturday we will have the 1st Annual Father's Day Pentathlon to decide who is the greatest father in Calmar!!! Don't worry about the word pentathlon – the events won't be things like pole vault or 1500m races. Instead they will be fun things that a father might have to do. I don't want to give away too much lest some of you get an unfair advantage in training but think of things a father would have to do for their kids and family... Deadline for registration is 4:30 p.m. Wednesday 05 June. There's no cost but we do need to know in advance how many will be participating.

Apparently tennis isn't too big here in Calmar so to try and maximize usage of facilities and to help give kids something to do, please note that on Tuesday nights from 7:00 - 8:30 p.m. Pastor Froese will be holding ball hockey at the tennis court at Centre Park. Other than this time of the week, the tennis court will be for tennis.

The Summer Get-A-Way will start on Tuesday 02 July and while registration forms are not ready yet, the deadline for registration and payment will be Wednesday 26 June. The Get-A-Way is a first class program (as can be evidenced by the incredible 58 registrations we had last year) and for many a year it has been significantly undervalued. In order to ensure that we can continue to provide quality programing registration rates have been adjusted (last year's increase was to help offset the cost of the field trip t-shirts the kids got to keep). For Calmar and Leduc County residents it will be \$25/wk and \$30/field trip or the entire 6-weeks for \$250. For those living elsewhere, the rates will be \$50/wk and \$60/field trip or \$500 for the entire program.





90 per cent of Albertans suffer from symptoms of dry eye New study finds most Albertans don't know this is treatable

As Albertans shake off the layers left behind from the brutal cold of winter, a new study reveals many are battling the symptoms of dry eye. Stinging, gritty, scratchy and uncomfortable eyes are just some of the signs that Alberta optometrists are encouraging people to be on the lookout for.

"Many Albertans aren't even aware that they are suffering from an eye condition," says Dr. Sara Starko, an optometrist in Calmar. "Often times we see patients try and treat the symptoms themselves, not realizing that dry eye can be a real issue and that their optometrist can help by properly assessing the cause and providing the best course of treatment."

The Alberta Association of Optometrists recently commissioned a survey to dig deeper into the issue of dry eye. The survey revealed that 90 per cent of Albertans have experienced the symptoms which also include fluctuating vision, a burning feeling or, most common among Albertans, the feeling of something foreign in the eye (74 per cent) and teary eyes (74 per cent).

"There are many factors that can cause dry eye symptoms," says Dr. Starko. "They can result from the normal aging process, hormonal changes, exposure to certain environmental conditions and irritants, UV exposure or problems with normal blinking. Medications such as antihistamines, oral contraceptives or antidepressants can also be a cause."

In moderate to severe cases, dry eye symptoms can lead to blurred vision, light sensitivity or even periods of excess tearing in response to the dryness. They can also make contact lens wear more difficult due to the increased irritation.

According to the new data, almost 3 in 5 Albertans who have experienced dry eye symptoms do not use anything to treat their dry eye. Dr. Starko says this statistic is concerning, as when left untreated, dry eye symptoms can cause tissue damage and scarring of the sensitive corneal tissues of your eye, leading to impaired vision.

While over-the-counter drops or lubricating eye treatments can temporarily mask the symptoms, Dr. Starko points out that these can, in some cases, make the situation worse. In fact, symptoms of dry eye may be indicative of a larger issue such as an eyelid infection or disease, which would require a proper diagnosis and treatment from an optometrist.

"I would encourage everyone to visit their optometrist for dry eye symptoms, as we are your best line of defense against any underlying issues that may be causing the problem," she says. "Appointments to treat conditions like dry eye, an eye infection or sudden changes in vision are covered by Alberta Health Care – the first step is to book an appointment."


