Finance Department First Quarter Report

Well, we are nearing the end of March and it surely has started warming up so we can emerge from the freezer we have been living in for the last few months.

The 2018 audit of the Town's affairs went very well during the month of February and the 2018 Financial Statements have been adopted by Town Council at their March 4th Regular Council Meeting. You can find a copy of the Financial Statements posted on the Town's website at <u>www.calmar.ca</u> or you can obtain a copy at the front desk at the Town Office. If you have questions in regards to the Statements, do not hesitate to call me at 780-985-3604 ext. 226 or email me at <u>mstorey@calmar.ca</u>.

Also, at the March 4th Regular Council Meeting, Council approved the 2019 Capital Budget and the "Municipal portion only" of the 2019 Operating Budget. Copies of each are also available at the front desk at the Town Office. The final draft of the 2019 Operating Budget will be presented to Council for approval once we receive the Provincial School Requisitions and we are able to pass the Tax Rate Bylaw. With the calling of the Provincial Election, it is unknown, at this time, as to when there will be a Provincial Budget approved and when we will receive the final Education Requisitions for finalization of the Town's 2019 Operating Budget. Until more definitive information is provided by the Province, we will have to wait and see!

FROM THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT

Not that I want to ruin anyone's day but I also don't want anyone to think I tried to bury this information if I put it later in this article...but at the Town Council meeting of 18 March Council passed resolutions that will see some rate increases taking place this year.

First, over at the Mike Karbonik Arena, effective the 2019 – 2020 ice season, there will be a change in how rental time is billed. Up to now, ice users have not been charged for flood times between games or after games/bookings. This will no longer be the case. Rental fees will be invoiced based on the start and end times of a booking and then 15 minutes will be charged for any required flood after the booking. So if there is a block booking for a tournament, the invoice would include the entire time in the block, not just game times, and then 15 minutes for the flood after the tournament. Using this example, if a tournament runs from 9am to 9pm on a Saturday, the tournament would be billed for 12.25 hours. This change was implemented due to the desire to increase ice revenue with the least impact upon the ice users. It was felt by the Recreation Board that this was the better solution than an actual increase in the hourly rates.

Over at the Program Centre, the desire was again to increase revenues and looking at other like facilities in the area, it was evident the Program Centre is being rented out at a very generous rate. Upon the recommendation of the Recreation Board, effective 01 September of this year, the rental rates of the Program Centre will be increased to \$30 for bookings of less than 4 hours and \$60 dollars for bookings of more than 4 hours FOR CALMAR and LEDUC COUNTY RESIDENTS. For residents of other areas such as the City of Leduc the rental rate will be \$50 for bookings of less than 4 hours and \$100 for bookings of more than 4 hours. The reason for this new rate is due to the fact that non-Calmar and non-Leduc County residents do not contribute toward the operating costs of the Program Centre and as such, they should not be entitled to the same subsidized rate as tax payers of Calmar and Leduc County.

Related to this situation, Town Council also approved a recommendation by the Recreation Board to alter the fee structure of the Summer Get-A-Way. Effective this year, any non-Calmar or Leduc County residents will be charged double of whatever the annually set fee for the Get-A-Way is for Calmar and Leduc County residents is. Last year the rate was \$15/week and \$20 per field trip or the whole 6 week program for just \$180. Often, a single week at another summer camp program will cost more than the entire 6 week rate we charge so even doing this, the non-tax payers are still getting a pretty good deal.

Okay, now on to happier things...

National Volunteer Week will be from the 7th – 13th of this month and as most of us know, community sports and recreation could not happen without the countless hours put in by volunteers. Did you know by 2018 active Calmar and area volunteers had contributed over 800 years of service!? Thank you to the many people who graciously give up their time so that others both young and old can enjoy and/or better themselves.

Here in Calmar and the surrounding area we will be thanking some of these volunteers at the annual Volunteer Appreciation Night on Saturday the 13th at the Royal Canadian Legion. For those who will have RSVP'ed for this evening there will be a supper catered by Bob Ronnie Catering (and if Bob's up to his usual standards, it will be absolutely delicious); prizes; and entertainment courtesy of hypnotist Jay Dee.

As usual, this night will also see us recognize our volunteers of the year as well as volunteers celebrating their 5th, 10th, 15th etc. year of service. Last year you may recall we changed things up a bit. Prior to 2018 all volunteers present were called up to receive their certificates. Last year we streamlined things by only calling up those celebrating their 5th, 10th, 15th etc. years and by having them come up as a group.

This year we are changing things again. We have decided to do away with the certificates and instead everyone will receive a pin (after this year, only first year volunteers will receive a pin). Then we will recognize those marking their 5th, 10th, 15th etc. years by giving them a special 'rocker' that attaches to their pin showing the number of years of service they have given. For those who have passed one of those milestone years and has not reached the next milestone year, their service has not been forgotten during this transition period. They will receive a rocker for their most recent milestone year. So, if Yvonne Doe has 37 years of service this year, we would give her a rocker for 35 years. The only thing is she would not be called up to receive her rocker. It would be given to her as she checked in or, if she were not present, to the contact person for the organization she volunteers for.



But is that what the community really needs or wants? Please let the Rec Board know. Ideas bounced around include unlighted soccer fields with 1 lighted ball diamond and no camping stalls or change room building but lots of parking. What do you think? The plan is to bring a vision to Council in time for 2020 budget deliberations so that development of this area can begin in 2020.


The challenge is on! Can you beat the Library Staff? Time to prove it! Come on down for an afternoon of fun and games. We have games for all ages.
