Utility e-Billing Registration Form

The Town of Calmar is now offering a free utility e-Billing option to customers with utility billing accounts. With this service customers can opt out of receiving a paper bill through the mail and instead elect to receive a utility bill notification via e-mail.

To get started, simply fill out and return the authorization form at the bottom of this page or email to <u>dparchoma@calmar.ca</u> with your full name(s), civic address(es) and account number(s). Customers may sign up more than one utility billing account for e-Billing.

Choosing to sign up for e-Billing will not affect the way you pay your utility bills. Customers will continue to have the following options for payment: Cash, Cheque, Debit, Online/Telephone Banking, and Pre-Authorized Debit.

If you decide to stop the e-Billing Notification service, simply e-mail your request to: dparchoma@calmar.ca or contact the Utility Billing Department at (780) 985-3604 Ext 222.

PLEASE NOTE:

If you change your email address you will be responsible for contacting the Utility Billing Department with your new information. Non-receipt of your e-bill is not justification for late payment and penalties will apply, as well as standard non-payment procedures as per the Utility Rates Bylaws.

All bi-monthly billings will be electronically delivered to the email address you provide on the first week of Jan, Mar, May, July, Sept, and Nov. If you do not receive your e-bill by these dates or have further questions about utility e-billing, please contact the Utility Billing Department at (780) 985-3604 Ext 222



A very simple yet elegant photo (in my opinion) that shows once again how a picture is worth a thousand words.

And what better than a photo of parents and children having something to eat to segue into our next item – the concession at the Mike Karbonik Arena (MKA).

In mid-January Creekwood Pizza asked to be released from its contract with the Town to operate the concession at the MKA. After reviewing their situation and performance it was felt the best thing was to agree to their request. Immediately after this we began work on finding a concession operator for next season.

Back in 2018 when we advertised for an arena concession operator we were approached by Coffee Pucks & Poutine who expressed a very strong interest. Unfortunately, they ended up going to Thorsby instead. I dug up their card and contacted them and they were more than happy to take on Calmar for 2019 – 2020. Then, to my pleasant surprise, they then asked if they could begin operating for the rest of this ice season. So on 01 February the MKA joined the Coffee Pucks & Poutine (CPP) family (they currently also operate the concessions at Warburg and, of course, Thorsby). CPP intends to be around for the long haul so hopefully the days of hit and miss concession service at the MKA are now a thing of the past.

Speaking of vacancies....over at the Program Centre (aka Scouts' Hall) Tuesday and Thursday evenings have been freed up. Tuesdays saw the fitness instructor decide to take a hiatus to pursue a once in a life time adventure while Thursday's fitness class ended due to licensing requirements. So if you just want to book space for your activities or if you are interested in running fitness classes in the Program Centre, just contact me at <u>bking@calmar.ca</u> or 780-985-3604 ext. 224 and we can get you on the schedule.

And now an FYI to answer a frequent question: "Why can't I get wi-fi at the MKA anymore?" The answer is because there has never been public wi-fi at the MKA. There is wi-fi for the Town's staff/computers and apparently, the password was given out to the public before my time. Almost a year ago, the company that looks after the Town Administration's IT needs checked things out at the MKA and they came back very upset to find out that public access to the Town's wi-fi had been set up. Apparently, this posed a security threat to the Town's data which involves every resident and business so in order to reduce the chance of any such information being compromised, the public access to the internal wi-fi was cut off. The option of true public wi-fi was then investigated and unfortunately, the cost of setting it up came in at approximately \$8,000 and there is no guarantee the signal would be strong enough to reach everywhere in the MKA due to the fact it is one giant concrete block (as an aside, it is still kind of iffy for me to get wi-fi when I am attending Oilers games at Rogers). Because of this it was decided to go without public wi-fi as currently there are more important things at the MKA where that \$8,000 plus can be applied to. Just remember folks, if you really need to connect to the internet when you are at the MKA you can always use your data plan.
