Finance Department Third Quarter Report

Well, we are heading rapidly into fall and eventually that dreaded 4 letter word "SNOW" will spring upon us. This time of the year is extremely busy for the staff with the preparation of the 2020-2022 Operating Budget and for the first time, as mandated by Alberta Municipal Affairs, a 5 year Capital Budget for 2020-2024. An "Asset Management Plan" is being prepared this fall which will assist the Town in identifying priorities in future year's Capital Budgets. We are gearing up to have the initial Departmental budget presentations ready for Council review in December and the finalized municipal portion of the budgets completed in January, 2020.

FROM THE ROECROEATION DEPARTMENT

12 September saw the annual Community Awareness Night at Calmar Elementary School. There were 23 groups present and Figure Skating and 4-H both reported scoring hat tricks in sign ups that night!

The new ice season at the Mike Karbonik Arena began on Monday 23 September. If anyone is interested in booking ice they can check on availability by going to https://app.bookking.ca/calmarpub/index.asp While there, you can also make your booking request which would also hold the slot for you and so you don't have to worry about someone else getting it if you decided to email or phone in your request later.

This same link can also be used for the Program Centre or the ball diamonds.

It might seem a ways down the road still but I have already started receiving enquiries and applications for the annual Christmas Craft Fair. This year's edition will be on Saturday 07 December, still at Calmar Elementary School. Unlike last year, spots this year will be capped so get your applications in now to avoid disappointment. Preference will be given to arts & crafts vendors if we hit capacity. Next in line would be other homemade products. Cost is still \$30 per table/spot. Application forms can be downloaded from the Town's website. This year will also feature concession service as Coffee, Pucks, & Poutine from the arena plans on being there.

The "Zolner" Park project is moving forward. For those unfamiliar with this it is the addition of 2 soccer fields and a 4th ball diamond just south of the existing ball diamonds. The site would also feature additional parking and a picnic area. What won't be there and what will be lost is camper parking for ball tournaments but the Town is looking at developing a proper campground for RVs. Select Engineering Ltd. has been chosen to do up the plans and guide the construction of the project. Maybe now might be a good time to start thinking about a real/permanent name for the site — and perhaps it should also include the existing ball diamonds? If you have any suggestions for a name and if you think the name should include the current ball diamonds, please email bking@calmar.ca. Speaking of the existing ball diamonds, a big thank you to the Hi-Way 39 Slo-Pitch League for getting a set of dugouts put in at diamond 1. These are a big improvement over just having benches there as now there is protection from the elements as well. Over the next few seasons, as they raise more money, Hi-Way 39 plans to get dugouts at all the diamonds.

I have been working in this position for nine months bringing over 10 years of economic development experience to administration, and a great passion for community development. I have learned a lot about Calmar in my time here, and have met many people who share in my excitement about the unlimited possibilites for Calmar. I look forward to connecting with anyone interested to learn about economic development opportunities in Calmar, or

those who may have ideas or connections to share with me. I will share project updates, resource information and additional tid-bits here in the Chronicle.

'BIG 7' Economic Development & Tourism Strategic Action Plan

A 5 year strategic action plan has been finalized and approved by Town Council guided by the Economic Development & Tourism Board with input from the businesses and residents of Calmar. The plan includes seven key goals and over 50 key activites.



- **Goal 1** By 2021, the Town of Calmar will have a dedicated Brand and targeted marketing initiatives to grow Calmar.
- **Goal 2** Calmar will develop a thriving destination tourism sector to attract year-round visitors to the community.
- **Goal 3** Calmar residents, businesses and visitors will easily have access to high quality high speed internet by 2022.
- **Goal 4** Downtown will become a pedestrian friendly destination with a clear brand and place for people to gather, live and support local businesses.
- **Goal 5** Calmar retains and attracts business investment that contributes to the long term financial sustainability of the Town.
- **Goal 6** The municipality plays a key role in acquiring financial support and investment to enhance and grow the community.
- **Goal 7** Community engagement is nurtured and leveraged to create opportunities for growth in Calmar.

Business Visitation Program

I am working my way around Calmar visiting local businesses to learn more about each business, understand opportunities and challenges within the business and share resources and information to support our locals.

For Sale or Lease

There are over nine commercial or industrial spaces for sale or lease in Calmar. I have begun developing a database of available space which will be updated monthly and listed on the Town's website under the

'Business' tab. I am launching a community task force to develop a plan for business attraction to better understand the capacity of each space and determine appropriate businesses for these spaces. Watch for more information about how you can submit your interest in joining this task force.

Opportunity Development Cooperative (ODC)

An ODC is a community led initiative to raise capital funds to invest in local economic development projects in the community. I, along with members of the Economic Development & Tourism Board will be hosting an information session about this initiative in October. If you have been intrigued enough to want to give back to your community with funds and time, then this initiative may be perfect for you. I will be looking for local champions to join us to develop the framework of this cooperative and identify potential development projects. Keep an eye out for more information about the information session and how you can submit your interest.

Remediation and Reclamation

There are several undevelopable areas of land within the community that have contamination. I have been working with the Alberta Energy Regulator, the Government of Alberta and the Alberta Urban Municipalities Association to fully explain the implications the contamination has on the viability of our community which impact our efforts to grow in all areas of residential, commercial and industrial development. I am leaning on the powers to be to understand the steps required to remediate the lands and gain additional support to clean these sites up.

Residential Attraction Campaign

The Town partnered with the Southbridge Crossing Development and London Homes on a residential attraction campaign. This campaign was designed to increase awareness about Southbridge Crossing, London Homes and the Town of Calmar. The campaign launched in the July and will run through to the end of September.
