



Communities in Bloom



It's that time of year again. Time just flies, especially with the summer we have just had. Wow! We certainly accomplished a lot this year with only a few dedicated volunteers. We managed to get the flower beds around town looking quite nice, the flower blooms were all dead headed, most of the obnoxious weeds were eliminated, and everything was in good shape for the judges.

Now that the summer rush is over, it is time to start cleaning up the gardens for the winter. We have pulled all the dead plants in all of the gardens and barrels. Den has done a lot of rototilling to get the beds ready for next Spring. We have planted 500 red tulip bulbs in the flower beds leading up to the Cenotaph. Thanks to Walter and his wonderful crew we had all new soil to plant in this year. As well, Cliff's Landscaping donated some mushroom compost to add to the tulip bed. Hayduk Lumber donated the stakes we used to mark out the tulip plots. Many thanks for your support.

We are presently beginning to make plans for next year. We will soon have to be ordering our hanging baskets. As well, we will need to order the flowers for the barrels. I am hoping we can do something quite different with the barrels next year, but I'm not giving away any secrets!

Fall is the time for home gardeners to clean up their yards and gardens so they will be ready for next Spring. Make sure you pull all the annual plants out of the ground. If you do this, you will be aerating your garden as well as letting the moisture down into the ground where it will be needed at planting time. If you grow iris or lily plants, let the green leaves completely wilt and then remove them from around the roots as this prevents rotting of the bulbs. If you grow hardy roses, make sure you water them well before freeze up as this helps protect the roots. Don't worry about cutting back your rose bushes now, it can be done in the Spring with the new shoots start to show. You may not have to prune as much as you think. As a general rule you can cut back most perennials such as Monks Hood, Delphiniums, and Asters, to the top of the soil. Don't prune your bleeding heart bushes, they will be just fine until Spring, when they start to show new growth you can remove the old stocks.

Autumn is also the season you should be raking up the leaves from deciduous trees and adding them to your composter. You should also give your lawn a final trim and apply a winter fertilizer. Remember a good thick lawn keeps out weeds. You can also give your lawn a final watering to help it through the winter. Cleaning up a little in the Fall will save you time in the Spring when you are in a rush to start the planting process all over again.

As a final note, Communities in Bloom is not just about flowers. It is a Canadian non-profit organization, committed to fostering civic pride, environmental responsibility, beautification and to improving quality of life through community participation, as well as the opportunity to participate in a national or provincial program.




