- In 1915, John McCrae, a doctor serving in the Canadian Artillery, wrote the famous poem *In Flanders Fields*.
- Canada adopted the poppy as the symbol for Remembrance Day in 1921.
- Approximately 21 million poppies are distributed across Canada every year.
- The Royal Canadian Legion suggests that the poppy be worn on the left lapel of a garment and as close to the heart as possible.
- Poppies were the first flowers to bloom on the battlefields in Belgium and France during the First World War.

Thank you to Councilors Krista Gardner and Keith Froese for the time and effort they put into the Recreation Board and its activities.

Congratulations to Economic Development and Calmar Secondary School for a very successful 3rd Annual "Nowhere to Run" back on 04 October. There were over 100 participants who helped raise funds toward mental health and walking trails in our Town.

In closing, "Thank you!" to the Hi-way 39 Slo-Pitch league for putting up 'dugouts' at Diamond 1. They not only look nice but will definitely give users of that diamond relief from Mother Nature, whether she be sunny, windy, or rainy. Over the next few years Hi-way 39 hopes to get 'dugouts' installed at the other 2 diamonds as well.






