### **Finance Department Third Quarter Report**

As we all deal with COVID-19, we are heading rapidly into the fall and eventually that dreaded 4 letter word "SNOW" will spring upon us. This time of the year is extremely busy for the staff with the preparation of the 2021 – 2023 Operating Budget and for the second time, as mandated by Alberta Municipal Affairs, a 5 year Capital Budget for 2021 – 2025. An "Asset Management Plan" is being finalized this fall which will assist the Town in identifying priorities in future year's Capital Budgets. We are gearing up to have the initial Departmental budget presentations ready for Council review in December and the finalized municipal portion of the budgets completed in January, 2021. One new item, in the 2021 Operating Budget, is a cost payable to the Province for policing in the amount of approximately \$40,000. Council will attempt to blend this cost into the Budget and try to minimize the impact on 2021 Municipal property taxes.

#### Subdivision and Development Appeal Board Public-At-Large Members Needed

The Town of Calmar has established a three (3) member Subdivision and Development Appeal Board (SDAB) comprised of the Public-At-Large. The purpose of the SDAB is to hear and rule on appeals of decisions of the Development Officer, Municipal Planning Commission or Town Council in regard to the approval or denial of development or subdivision applications within the Town.

Pursuant to Provincial Regulation, SDAB members must attend a training workshop, sponsored by Alberta Municipal Affairs, to receive certification before participating in a SDAB Hearing. All costs of participating in the training are covered by the Town. A successful applicant will be required to attend the training workshop when they are scheduled around the Province.

The Town has filled two of the three positions for certified members of the Public-At-Large and has the need for one more individual to fill the Board. The Town of Calmar invites written applications, from interested persons, requesting appointment to the Board. Applicants should submit reasons for their interest in the vacancy and provide any relevant experience in the area of development.

#### PEACE OFFICER CORNER

Hello Town of Calmar...

I began to write this piece with the thought of updating issues and concerns I have been receiving over the past while. I decided to erase and start from scratch in a different direction because of the times we are in at the moment....

I was in Safeway the other day by the floral department and a man was looking at the flowers in the flower section. The man looked at me and said " If your looking for help in this area you're going to have to wait a while. I asked someone to send a person so I can get some help and buy some flowers five minutes ago. They must think I have all day!". I said to the man that I would go to customer service and see if I could get him some help. He just said good luck! I was at customer service and a lady explained to me that the floral department was in a quick 15 minute meeting and someone would be available after that time. As she spoke the man came over and heard what she had to say. He replied to her, "We are the customers here, so they can stop the meeting and come service us!" He continued with other inflammatory statements that I felt were unwarranted. The lady stated she would call the people in the meeting and let them know his thoughts and his needs. I walked back to the floral department with this man and asked how he likes having to wear a mask while out in public. Lets just say he went on a 5 minute rant of how it was not necessary. I then said to the man. "Even if I agree with you, which I don't, if wearing a mask is the worst part of your life, I want your life." He paused and looked at me; I could see a smile forming under his mask, and he replied, "You are absolutely right, it must be the crappy weather or lack of sleep that put me in a cranky mood." I said for him to try and have a better day and not to let this floral issue ruin it. He kind of chuckled and said, "I'll try." I finished my shopping and entered the till at the same time as the man who was at the floral department was leaving the till. The cashier was the same lady at customer service we spoke to earlier. The initial idea is to host a monthly market throughout the winter months and segue into a weekly market for spring, summer and fall. A list of potential vendors is being collected now. 

## Town of Calmar 2021 Municipal Election

October 18th, 2021 brings us to another round of General Municipal Elections, across Alberta, for the positions of Mayors, Reeves, Aldermen and Councilors for local jurisdictions. In Calmar, residents will elect a Mayor and four Councilors. Nomination forms will be placed on the Calmar website or will be available in December 2020 at the Town Administration Building located at 4901 – 50<sup>th</sup> Avenue. All persons wishing to file a nomination paper, with the Returning Officer, must also file an Application for Registration of Notice of Intent to Become a Candidate for Municipal Office which is a declaration regarding campaign financing.

In 2019 and again in 2020, the Local Authorities Election Act was changed by the Province of Alberta. One of the major changes is that any eligible person may file a nomination with the Returning Officer at any time during regular business hours between January 2, 2021 and 12:00 Noon on Nomination day which is four (4) weeks prior to Election day which will be September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021. The 2-hour restriction (10am to 12am Noon) on Nomination Day only, for filing nomination papers, has been eliminated.

With COVID-19, the Administration Office business office hours are restricted at present. Watch the Town's website at <u>www.calmar.ca</u> for any changes in business hours.




#### TIPS TO SAVE WATER AROUND YOUR HOME

()

Reliable access to safe water is critical to the long-term viability of a community. Drinking water for CRSWSC member communities comes from the North Saskatchewan River, via EPCOR. Although an uninterrupted supply of clean, drinking water is almost always achieved in our region, various levels of restrictions can be placed on a community. usually during hot, dry weather conditions.

Water conservation measures are encouraged in municipalities year round to help mitigate future risks posed by population growth and climate change. Further, water and sewer infrastructure present significant capital and operational expenses and it is important to use this infrastructure efficiently.

#### **TIPS TO SAVE WATER** AROUND YOUR BUSINESS



Green landscaping: Consider planting native trees and shrubs with a rock garden to avoid the need for watering.

Remind employees to be conscientious of water use. For larger businesses, get a professional water audit, which can identify actions to save money.

Typical of most communities, the residential sector consumes most (approximately 60%) of all water purchased.

Consider a water-efficient showerhead. They're inexpensive, easy to install, and can save you at least 3000 liters a month.

Upgrade older toilets with water efficient models. You could save over 300 litres per day per household.



Run your washing machine and dishwasher only when they are full.

When shopping for a new washing machine, compare resource savings among Energy Star models. Some of these can save at least 75 litres per load, and energy too.



Consider upgrading faucets, refrigerators, air conditioners and ice-makers with water-saving aerators and cooling systems.

Keep a pitcher of water in the refrigerator instead of running the tap. The CRSWSC provides good, clean water for drinking; let's make the most of it!



مممم In the summer, watering lawns is also a significant water use and can increase daily amounts by up to 50%. Follow your

municipality's lawn watering directions. Many have a voluntary alternate day program where residents of odd-numbered houses should water on odd calendar days, and residents with even numbers should water on even calendar days.

Three centimetres of watering per week is adequate for established lawns. Use a rain gauge, empty tuna can, or upside down Frisbee, to measure rainfall on your lawn.

The Capital Region Southwest Water Services Commission (CRSWSC) was established on Sept. 1, 1984 and today is a regional co-operation providing clean, safe drinking water to the City of Leduc, Leduc County, City of Beaumont, the Edmonton International Airport (EIA), the Town of Calmar, the Village of Hay Lakes, Camrose County and the Town of Millet.


