Huntington disease (HD) is an inherited brain disorder. HD causes cells in parts of the brain to die: specifically the caudate, the putamen and, as the disease progresses, the cerebral cortex. As the brain cells die, a person with Huntington's becomes less able to control movements, recall events, make decisions and control emotions. Royal Canadian Legion - Remembrance Day Information



On November 11, each year, our community members gather at the Royal Canadian Legion - Calmar Branch, standing in collective Remembrance of all who have fallen in the service of our country.

The Royal Canadian Legion Calmar Branch is proud to organize and conduct this commemoration on behalf of and for all Canadians.

Our Ceremony will take place at the Royal Canadian Legion Calmar, located at 4815 - 47 Street, Calmar, Alberta on November 11.

All Veterans are welcome to join the Veterans Parade; form up at 0945hrs. The parade commences at 0950hrs, moving from the Legion doors around to the west-side of the building to our newly built cenotaph, where the public will be waiting.

The wreath laying ceremony will include a dedication of our cenotaph, by Padre Froese, to all Veterans who have died in the Canadian Armed forces, the commonwealth or its wartime allies, regular members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Peace Officers in a Special Duty Area, or on a Special Duty Operation, the Merchant Navy, or Ferry Command during wartime.

The post-ceremony parade will then return to the Legion. There will be a frief intermission and then our commemoration and wreath laying ceremony will continue.

Arriving early helps to get a good vantage point.

Our video screen will display the Virtual Wall of Honour and Remembrance. Afterward a light lunch will be served. 


