





MAYOR'S CORNER

A wonderful summer has come to an end and we are into Fall. Mark your calendars for the Annual Fall Clean Up, which will take place from October 5 to 9.

At the September 21 council meeting we had Inspector Kevin Kunetski from the Leduc RCMP come out and talk about policing in our community. There is going to be a policing survey released on January 1, 2016 to every home in Calmar. It would be greatly appreciated if residents could fill out the survey so that Council and the RCMP can get a better feel for the needs of our Community.

Council could hire another Community Peace Office (CPO) at a cost of around \$75,000.00 a year for 40 hours per week to enforce Town Bylaws. Or we could hire a dedicated RCMP officer for Calmar, which would cost \$150,000.00 per year for a 3 year term at 40 hours per week. This survey is very important to our Town and will help Council make this decision.

Due to complaints from business and the safety of our residents the Town has removed the trees on the south side of Main street in order to make the sidewalk wider. We consulted with an arborist and the trees were moved to a park location. The Arborist stated that the wrong type of tree was planted in the sidewalk and that the trees would eventually damage the sidewalk and the street.

We have also been experiencing traffic delays on the east end of Town. This road construction is necessary so that a new intersection can be built for movement in and out of the new 32 acre industrial park.

Council is going over the Land Use Bylaw and we would like community input into the changing of these bylaws. We will be giving further notice to the public as to when these meetings will take place. This is your chance to be heard!
