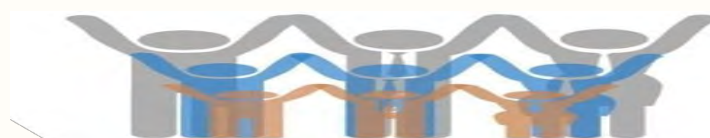

2017 Town of Calmar Municipal Election

2017 brings us to another round of Municipal Elections, across Alberta, for the positions of Mayor and Councilors for each local jurisdiction. In Calmar, residents will elect a Mayor and four Councilors. Nomination forms can be found on the Calmar website or are available at the Town Administration Building located at 4901 – 50th Avenue. All persons wishing to file a nomination paper must also file an Application for Registration of Notice of Intent to Become a Candidate for Municipal Office which is a declaration in regard to campaign financing.

Nomination day is Monday, September 18th, 2017 between the hours of 10:00am and 12:00 Noon at the Board Room located in the Town Administration Building. Check the Town's website for more information in regard to the responsibilities of elected officials.

Election Day is Monday, October 16th, 2017 and voting will take place between the hours of 10:00am and 8:00pm in the Town of Calmar Council Chambers located in the Town Administration Building (entrance from 49th Street). For those unable to vote on Election Day, an Advance Vote will take place on Saturday, October 14th, 2017 between the hours of 1:00pm and 4:00pm again in the Town Council Chambers.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Nomination Day: Monday, September 18, 2017 from 10am – 12pm - Town of Calmar Board Room, 4901-50 Avenue.

Election Day: Monday, October 16, 2017 from 10am – 8pm – Calmar Council Chambers, 4901-50 Avenue.

Advance Vote Day: Saturday, October 14, 2017 from 1pm – 4pm - Calmar Council Chambers, 4901-50 Avenue.
Advance Votes are held to allow electors who are unable to vote on Election Day to cast their ballots.

Who can be a candidate?

On the day that you submit your Nomination Form, you must be qualified to hold office.

Candidate for the offices of Mayor or Councillor must be:

- ✓ A resident of the Town of Calmar for 6 months preceding the nomination day
- ✓ A Canadian citizen
- ✓ At least 18 years old
- ✓ Not prohibited from voting by law

To be considered for declaration as a legally qualified municipal candidate, you must file a Nomination Paper and Candidate's Acceptance form that must have the signatures of 5 ELECTORS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE, in accordance with sections 27 and 47 of the Local Authorities Election Act (form attached). Nomination Forms will be accepted between 10:00am and 12:00pm on September 18, 2017, at the Town of Calmar Board Room.

FORTISALBERTA RECEIVES APPROVAL TO PROCEED WITH LED STREETLIGHT CONVERSIONS

Calgary, Alta. – May 17, 2017 – FortisAlberta, an electricity distribution company dedicated to delivering safe and reliable electricity to the homes, farms and businesses of more than half a million customers, has received approval from the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC) to proceed with LED streetlight conversions in more than 130 communities within the company's service territory.

The initial application to convert existing streetlights under the LED Streetlight Conversion program was made in April 2016 and at that time six communities including Canmore, Crowsnest Pass, Devon, Okotoks, St. Albert and Wetaskiwin underwent conversions. Another application for an additional 131 communities was made to the AUC and FortisAlberta has received approval to continue.

"This is a huge win for our municipal customers who have been seeking a viable and cost-effective option for their existing streetlights," says Don Hughes, Director, Business Development.

LED technology offers many benefits, including reduced energy consumption, resulting in lower costs for our customers. The LED technology FortisAlberta is installing will use a warmer light, resulting in minimal blue light exposure. The fixtures are dark sky friendly with zero up-light, which means less light pollution and/or sky glow as the light is directed downward. The current high-pressure sodium bulbs produce a light that appears orange; the new LED lights will produce a whiter light, resulting in a higher light quality that improves safety.

As FortisAlberta begins conversions in each community, local media and community offices will be contacted with specific information relating to their area. Conversions are expected to take place starting the end of May and will continue over the next year.

SAFETY TIPS FOR Back to SCHOOL

*If you pass a school bus that has its alternating amber lights flashing, pass with caution.

*When the school bus stops to let students on or off, its alternating red lights will begin flashing. You will also see a stop sign extended from the left side of the school bus. **You must come to a full stop about 20 meters (about four to five car lengths) away from the school bus.**

This distance allows drivers of other vehicles behind you to see the flashing lights and students crossing the highway.

BE CAUTIOUS!

*You must remain stopped until the alternating flashing red lights are turned off and the stop sign on the driver's side is no longer extended.

PEACE OFFICER'S CORNER

Good day to the residence and businesses in Calmar. An update regarding the on goings within our Town. Unleashed dogs, loose dogs, and dog bites have become a problem. We have had three dog bites to date with many complaints of loose dogs. Loose dogs will be caught and taken to the Town pound, and fines will be issued to the owners. The dog bites are being investigated with a possible fine being served to the owners. An increase in stray cats seem to be on the rise again. Traps will be put out with those cats being taken to our Town pound as well.

With School right around the corner, speed through our school zones will be closely monitored, as well as the crossing areas throughout the Town.

Quads ripping through Town are unacceptable and will be SEIZED as well as the owners fined for no insurance and invalid registration. READ YOUR DOCUMENTS, they say OHV, OFF HIGHWAY VEHICLE. Therefore charges and tickets can be handed out if Quads are on any roadway a vehicle drives on. It is a privilege, not a right, with any discretion I use in allowing safe behavior of quad drivers to exit/enter the Town on the shortest path. It is not only dangerous for vehicle traffic, but a safety risk to all pedestrians. There will be zero tolerance for those who decide to disrupt Town safety.

On a more positive note, I would like to thank the Town residence for taking care of their yards and lawn. I see very few homes that have issues, which speaks to the pride of our Town residence. With fall clean up approaching, I encourage all to take advantage and get rid of refuse that may have come from your summer projects. 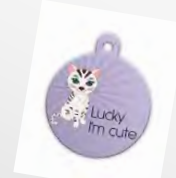
