Calmar Days the Calmar Way!

This year's Calmar Days 17 – 19 August was another fun filled weekend for residents and visitors of Calmar alike.

Activities kicked off Friday evening with the start of the annual Slo-Pitch tournament. This year's edition featured the largest turnout yet with 20 teams – up from the usual 16 – and a waiting list of 8 teams. The big attraction was highlighted by a ceremonial first pitch to commemorate the first ever game completely played in Calmar under artificial lighting. With MLA Mark Smith on the mound and Mayor Wally Yachimetz behind the plate, the crowd saw a perfect strike from Mr. Smith – this might have been a sign for things to come. With the exception of a nasty thundershower later that Friday evening, the tournament went smoothly thanks to the work of tournament organizers Kelly and Rich Goldsworthy. The games under the lights were a big hit (no pun intended) with the players and this would not have been possible without the generous support of Latmann Equipment Ltd. who donated the lights and power not only for the ball tournament but for the beer gardens and the kids activities as well. In the end, BSNS out of Edmonton topped Calmar's own Beerly Legal for the championship.

South of the ball diamonds was the Movie Under the Stars. At the start, the temperature was in the low 20s and the wind was negligible. At 9:15 a crowd of approximately 90 people settled back to enjoy.....two thirds of a great movie. Unfortunately, Mother Nature did something very few people have ever done – she stopped Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson cold in his tracks as the rain started to fall around 10:20 and by 10:30 a torrential downpour ended the showing. On the bright side, we made it further than we did last year.

Saturday was a busy day. Things started very early as people were setting up for the Mega Market even before 7:00 a.m. Over at the Curling Rink the Bench Show opened its doors to the public at 8:00 a.m. and the Calmar Dental Clinic and JDRF hosted the pancake breakfast, which raised \$2000! CFCW came down to visit before heading over to take part in the parade.

The parade saw 25 entrants and 27 vehicles/floats/groups of walkers entertain onlookers. Led by the Royal Canadian Legion and with the Leduc County Fire Department proudly in the rearguard, the parade handed out lots of candy for kids of all ages to enjoy. Prior to the parade rolling down main street, the judges chose Calmar Minor Hockey to be the Best in Show.

While the Mega Market continued, the kids' activities got underway at the Mark Karbonik Arena parking lot. Whether it was the petting zoo, the face painting, the bouncy castles, or the Euro Bungy, all you could see were kids having a blast!

For adults, there was also the Mini-Fringe at the Curling Rink as well as the Show & Shine, Mini Art Walk, beer garden, and military displays at the Royal Canadian Legion.

Finally, at 11:00 p.m. Saturday night there was the crowning glory to Calmar Days – the fireworks. With the temperature at a tolerable 13C and with the smoke having eased up, for a quarter of an hour Fireworks Spectacular lit up the skies much to the enjoyment of everyone.

Events like Calmar Days do not just happen. The hard work of many people – volunteers and staff alike – combine to make these fun filled times a reality. Space precludes me from naming everyone but thank you to all the volunteers, staff, and businesses who helped with logistics and planning for the ball tournament, the beer gardens, the Bench Show, the parade, the face painting, all of the activities at the Legion, the pancake breakfast, the Movie Under the Stars, the fireworks and the Mini-Fringe.

Intermunicipal Collaboration Frameworks Intermunicipal Development Plans **Project**

August 8, 2018

A collaborative initiative is being undertaken by Leduc County and the Towns of Calmar, Thorsby and the Village of Warburg to respond to new provincial requirements to prepare Intermunicipal Collaboration Frameworks (ICFs) and Intermunicipal Development Plans (IDPs).

An ICF and IDP will be prepared between Leduc County and the Town of Calmar, between Leduc County and the Town of Thorsby and between Leduc County and the Village of Warburg.

Each set of plans (IDPs and ICFs) will outline future use of lands adjacent to each Town and the Village boundaries and review the municipal services provided to ratepayers.

Stantec Consulting has been hired to prepare the IDPs and ICFs which will reflect each of the communities' aspirations, support sustainable service provision and create a roadmap to guide future growth and development of these communities over the next 20 years.

The ICFs and IDPs will be developed with input from stakeholders, and the community. Additional information on this project, including engagement opportunities, are available on each of the municipal websites noted below.




Subsidized counselling service
