A couple issues back we showed you an update from the Clouston family who were featured in Vol. 1 and this month, here is a submission from a family that moved to Calmar after Vol. 1 was printed.

The House with the Red Door- 5103-50 Ave Calmar

As a young couple looking to buy our first home, we instantly fell in love when we walked onto the property of 5103-50 Ave. It had a massive yard (albeit overgrown), and a beautiful old home that was the perfect size! The house was built in 1946 and had so many of the character features we both loved; coved ceilings, interesting plaster details, and enough original elements still intact we thought it possible to bring it back to life with just a little sweat equity! The home, unfortunately, had been vacant for almost a year (except the families of squirrels living in the ceiling) and needed some structural work to get it into livable shape. Fortunately, we were young and naive and decided to move ahead with the sale! In November of 2009, we became first time homeowners to one of the most recognizable homes in Calmar!

In talking with neighbours and local businesses, we learned quickly that locals knew our property as "The McKerracher House" (the name of the previous owners of 30+ years) and we used this name to identify it for years. After replacing the front door and painting it red, we now describe it as "the house on 39 with the red door". There would be few people in town who would not be familiar with our house because of its exposure and heritage. We learned we are just the THIRD owner of this home (despite its age) and we hope to call it home for years to come like the previous owners before us!

We have spent the last 10+ years trying to bring our diamond in the rough back to its original glory! Many suggested we just gut everything back to the studs and start fresh but that would defeat the purpose of buying a character home and instead we have spent our time patching falling plaster, scouring salvage yards to match existing wood work and buying vintage fixtures to keep as much as we can true to the age of the home! The project, like ALL restoration projects, has taken us longer than we anticipated and we are still not even close to completion, but we love our heritage home and with every coat of paint, or piece of new molding, we get closer and closer to the home we envisioned when we first walked in the door!

Calmar is our home now. In our decade here we have gotten married, had three beautiful girls and really love living in this family friendly community! Our kids love the new playground at the ball diamonds, Calmar Days and OF COURSE the Library!! Our oldest daughter attends Zirka dance and all our kids go to the daycare right here in town! We are regulars at Hayduk Lumber and the Bakery and there has seldom been a time we couldn't find what random thing we needed at Calmar Pharmacy. Calmar has EVERYTHING a young family needs and we are so happy we chose Calmar as home!

Over at the ball diamonds there has always been an issue with balls landing in people's yards etc. Unfortunately, at present there is little that can further be done to accommodate everyone but in the interest of safety, I have asked the ball players to borrow a page from the game of golf. I have asked the ball players to yell "Fore" when a long ball gets launched out of Diamond 3. It will not prevent cars or houses from being dinged but hopefully it does keep residents safer as if you hear "Fore", be aware a ball is incoming. I have asked that the ball players yell "Fore" whether they see anyone in the yards or not because they could easily miss seeing someone. If any residents are in their yards and a ball comes over without someone having yelled "Fore" as a warning, please get in touch with me and I will investigate the matter with the ball players.

Despite Covid-19 the Mike Karbonik Arena plans to be up and running for ice in September. At a special ice users meeting July 28th the Town went over the various guidelines that will have to be adhered to so that all regular users of ice can be accommodated. It was encouraging to see the general consensus was one of cooperation as everyone wants to make sure we can have a successful ice season for 2020 – 2021. Among things to consider, masks will be mandatory in the front lobby and hallways, traffic flow will be one way, and no spectators will be allowed. Please note the key word is 'spectators'. If you are there to help run a program or because your kids need assistance, you are not a spectator and are welcome to stay. Please note that there will be no bleacher seating, only 2 people allowed in a washroom at any one time, and there will be no concession service this year. Also, unfortunately due to

Covid-19 guidelines, we will not be able to offer either Shinny Hockey or Public Skating at the Mike Karbonik Arena this upcoming ice season. Hopefully the weather will cooperate and people can make use of the outdoor rink north of Woodland Park.

On October 28th will be our long delayed Canada Day celebration and the promised Drive In movie as well (weather permitting). The location will be the usual Movie Under the Stars location but there will be strict guidelines for parking and social distancing that we will release closer to the date. So come for the movie, some belated Canada Day celebrating, and if things go as planned, fireworks to end the evening.

Last but not least, we are getting more registrations in for the Christmas Craft Fair Saturday November 7th at the Royal Canadian Legion. It is hoped that the change to a more visible location and earlier date will help reenergize the event. Remember, vendors will be limited due to Covid-19 restrictions and guidelines so if you wish to be a vendor please get your applications in A.S.A.P.

Although things do look a little different, we are still here to help you in any way we can and we thank you for your patience and understanding as we all adjust.

In case you missed it, here is what to expect when you come to the library.

Hours of Operation:

Tuesday: 10:00 am to 4:00 pm

Wednesday: 10:00 am to 12:00 pm (Vulnerable Sector)

1:00 pm to 6:00 pm

Thursday: 10:00 am to 4:00 pm

Grab-and-Go available during open hours.

Facility

- We will be monitoring the number of patrons in the building to ensure we follow social distancing protocol.
- We are asking patrons to do their best to limit their time in the library to a maximum of 15 minutes if there are others waiting to come in.
- One person down an aisle at one time for browsing.
- A maximum of two families at one time in the children's area will be permitted, if social distancing can be maintained.
- Tables and chairs have been removed at this time.
- No washroom available.
- Drinking fountain is not available.
- Patrons are encouraged to use the hand sanitizer located throughout the library.
- Magazine area is closed to the public.

Computers, Printers and Fax

- Patrons will be asked to wear a mask when using the computers. Please bring your own if you have one. Masks will be provided for those who do not have one.
- Two computers will be available by appointment only. Please call ahead to book your time: 780.985.3472
- Time on the computer will be limited.
- Printing and Faxing services are available.

Borrowing and Returns

- We encourage patrons to **Grab'n'Go** when you come to the library. This means requesting your materials in advance. Requests can be made through our web page www.calmarpubliclibrary.ca using Tracpac, emailing circulation@calmarpubliclibrary.ca, or calling 780.985.3472 to speak to one of our staff. Please wait for notification that your item is ready for you to pick up.
- All returned items will be quarantined for 5 days before being available for circulation.

Staff

- Face coverings will be worn by all staff if they are outside the staff only areas.
- Circulation desk is equipped with plexiglass barriers to ensure the safety of staff and patrons.


Government of Alberta is improving access to driver medical exams

As of June 30, 2020, nurse practitioners are authorized to complete driver medical examination forms.

Before this regulation amendment, only physicians could complete driver medical examination forms in Alberta. Driver medical examinations are required at specified intervals for drivers age 75 or older, commercial drivers, and those with certain medical conditions.

The government will engage with other health-care professional regulatory colleges to determine if other health-care providers are also qualified to conduct driver medical examinations.

Calmar Optometrist: Comprehensive Eye Exams a Must Before School Starts

Whether at home or in the classroom, learning and vision go hand in hand

As parents and children prepare for the upcoming school year, Alberta optometrists are encouraging parents to add booking a comprehensive eye exam to their to-do list. Regardless of what school looks like in September, vision remains imperative to a child's learning success. With optometry clinics implementing enhanced safety measures, parents can feel safe when booking an eye appointment for their children.

"A comprehensive eye exam should be part of every student's back-to-school routine, and this year is no exception. Whether school happens at home or in the classroom, vision and learning always go hand in hand," says Dr. Sara Starko, an optometrist in Calmar. "With 80 per cent of learning being visual, vision problems can significantly impact a child's ability to learn."

According to the Alberta Association of Optometrists, one in four school-aged children has a vision problem, which can affect proper learning and development if left untreated. Many children with vision problems are often misdiagnosed as having learning or behavioural difficulties such as ADHD or dyslexia.

Dr. Starko warns that it's easy for parents to overlook vision problems among their children, as many symptoms can be difficult to detect without an eye exam.

"Many children accept their vision as normal because they don't know any better, or because they have one eye doing most of the work, which compensates for poor vision in the other eye," says Dr. Starko. "It's normal for a return to school to bring previously unsurfaced vision problems to light as schoolwork places greater demands on a child's visual skills."

Dr. Starko urges parents to proactively book their children a comprehensive eye exam before school starts. A comprehensive eye exam can help detect vision and eye health problems, especially those common in school-aged children, including farsightedness or nearsightedness.

Nearsightedness, also known as myopia, is a common eye condition among youth. A study conducted by the Centre for Ocular Research & Education, the University of Waterloo and the Canadian National Institution for the Blind found that myopia impacted 29 per cent of children aged 11 to 13 studied. Myopic children may have difficulty reading the board or seeing images/words on television.

"Myopia is a common vision problem among school-aged children, but the good news is that is can be easily corrected with glasses," says Dr. Starko. "Like all eye health and vision problems, the sooner a condition is identified, the easier it is to treat."

Parents are encouraged to speak with their optometrist about Alberta Heath coverage for comprehensive eye exams for children under the age of 19. Clinic staff will also discuss what parents and children can expect from their upcoming visit.

The Town offers a penalty free payment plan specially for Tax Accounts. (TIPS)

You can sign up anytime through out the year! (You will need to pay up front for the months that have already passed, to stay caught up).

All you need is a signed Pre-Authorized Debit form and a VOID Cheque/Direct Deposit paper from your bank.
