Ask your CAO

As we wrap up another cold-snap, I took some time to reflect on my first 6 month as Calmar's Chief Administrative Officer (CAO). Some of you may ask what a CAO is and what are the position duties? Well, CAO is simply the official name given to the Town Manager as per the Municipal Government Act (MGA). The MGA is the provincial Act that dictates what municipalities are entitled/empowered to do, and how they must go about conducting their business.

As the head of the administration, the CAO answers directly to Council. The duties of the CAO include:

- Advising Council as necessary;
- Being responsible for the administration, operation, financial management, and human resources of the Town;
- Implementing Council's decisions, policies, regulations;
- · Determine the sufficiency of any petitions; and
- · Various other task identified in the MGA and by Council.

Since I have started last June, I had the privilege to talk with many residents, business owners, employees, and organization representatives. There is a lot of positive going-on for the community, but I also noticed that we have some challenges.

First, I will acknowledge that the relationships between Town Hall, the residents, and the various groups/organizations of the community need some love. I have heard several times that communication and trust is lacking, that we need to be better. Message received. Team Calmar is putting considerable efforts to be more active, involved, and available. The Chronicle is one of the many ways that we are hoping to interact. You can always book an appointment with Administration and/or invite us to your event/meeting/business. We want to hear from you, your perspective on your community. We need your feedback to identify where we are doing a good job and where we need to improve.

We also know that with inflation and the cost of living rising, we need to be more efficient in our service delivery. Like you, we need to find ways to stretch the dollars as much as possible. Throughout the year, we will analyze activities and level of services to identify additional ways to create savings.

Communication-Communication-Communication! We need to find better ways to communicate with the residents. We currently use the website, Facebook, the digital sign by the arena, the Chronicle, the Devon Dispatch, and signs in the Town's office doors to inform the community. We will need to hear from you on which tools are more practical and/or preferred.
