MAYORS CORNER

Happy May! Spring is here!

I would like to start off first by saying Happy Mother's Day to all the wonderful mothers out there. Mothers are often taken for granted and we do not spend enough time recognizing their contribution to family or the community. We appreciate all that you do, and we hope that on May 14, 2023 you have an amazing day and enjoy time with family and loved ones.

Council has passed it's 2023-2026 Operational budget with 2023 budget at \$7.094M which represents a 2.7% overall increase. This increase comes from various sources with the largest being an increase in property tax collection of 1.3%. The increase in tax represents increase in local property values as assessed and increased number of taxable properties in the community. Council did make a concerted effort to lower our mill rates over last year for both residential and non-residential properties. Watch your mail, tax notices will be coming out shortly. Council has passed our 2023-2027 Capital budget with 2023 budgeted spend of \$1.291M of which \$1.100M will be spend on sanitary line replacement on 51st street due to a failing line. This unfortunately will leave very little left in our capital plan for other projects in 2023 as our community has struggled to build the appropriate reserves to assist with infrastructure replacements. Council is aware of this and is making our reserve funding a bigger priority but trying to do it without burdening the taxes payers any more than necessary. Yes, we do plan each year for amounts into reserves to build funds for future needs, that is being responsible.

We have received recent complaints about the use of off-road vehicles within our community and the activities that are happening outside of the allowed hours or operation. Please remember everyone (including children of families with these machines) Calmar has a very specific bylaw (2020-14) related to ATV usage in town and what is allowed, everything else is considered not allowed. You can find the bylaw on our town website. Please also familiarize yourself with the Leduc county bylaw (Traffic bylaw NO. 08-22) as they also have specific rules for the use of ATV's. If we cannot follow the rules then we will have to ask that they will be enforced, which will bring fines and/or seizure of the units. Please do not wreck it for others who do follow the rules.

Many people will be bringing their RV units home to make ready for the season. Please make yourself aware of the RV parking rules in our community and please be respectful of your neighbors, community and traffic requirements. RV's take up a lot of space, so we need to make sure our roadways and access to driveways remains safe for all on the roads.

The Subdivision Authority is pleased to have reviewed and approved the next phase of subdivision in the Highway 39 Industrial area which will allow for the creation of 8 more commercial lots in that area.

Did you know that Calmar has a branch and grass drop off area? For more information pleases reach out to the Town office. Watch the website and social media for more information on Spring clean up as that is the middle of May.

Ask your CAO

In the April edition of the Chronicle, I invited residents to reach out to me with questions, concerns, or simply to chat about Calmar. A few residents decided to take this opportunity. First, an active resident noticed that one of our exercise equipment in Centre Park was unsafe. The equipment had a pointy plastic piece that was sticking out of the handle on the bench press. Within an hour of being notified, we were able to dispatch an employee to address the situation by removing the pointy plastic piece that was a hazard. Our staff took the opportunity to evaluate the equipment to make sure that everything else was adequate. Thanks to this resident, Centre Park was made safer.

Another resident called about kids climbing extremely high in trees within Westview Park. Once notified of the situation, we were also able to dispatch a staff within a few minutes to remove and secure the picnic tables that the kids were using to reach the lower branches. The following morning, staff returned to trim the tree in question to make sure that kids would not be able to climb it anymore. Again, through the intervention of a resident, we were able to make Calmar safer.

A third resident gave us a shout about noise being emitted by vehicles. This one was a bit more challenging to handle. The Town of Calmar does have a Community Standards bylaw (available on Town's website) that deals with noise coming from vehicles on properties. The bylaw prohibits excessive revving of engine and excessive music. However, there are no decibels attached to the regulation. It is written this way to minimize the Town's involvement in people's lifestyle and liberties. It still provides the Town of Calmar some ability to intervene should a resident decide to be completely unreasonable. Such intervention can be in the form of education, warning, and/or ticketing. As most residents are courteous and mindful of their neighbours, we typically do not receive many complaints related to noise.

I would like to take this opportunity to encourage residents to minimize their impact on their neighbours. If you know that you will need to do something that might be noisy/loud, talk with your neighbours ahead of time. Also, avoiding nighttime is always better as ambient noise during the day will minimize your impact.

Lastly, I would like to invite members of this community to reach out to me and our Administration. The feedback/questions received help us improve service delivery, make Calmar safer, and provide us topics for future communications.






