MAYORS CORNER

Hello, September and goodbye August. Here's to an exciting, joyful, enjoyable, peaceful, and blessed month

Calmar Days was again a great weekend in our great community. I would like to extend a huge thank you from Council to all the volunteers and Town staff for your great smiles and dedication to making our festival such a great event. Thank you to Jaidan Energy for hosting the annual ball tournament and cabaret over the weekend. Jaidan Energy and the generosity of the community raised an ~\$7000 for future recreation improvements in our community. We would like to thank Remax Realty (Chris Feist) and Ales Wine & Spirits (Mills family) for the sponsorship of the events over the weekend.

August recognized the start of a sewer replacement project that will see the replacement of sewer along 51st street from highway 39 north to 51st avenue then east to 50th street. The cost of this much needed replacement is estimated at \$1.1 million. Council passed 2nd and 3rd reading of Bylaw 2023-24 an Amendment to Land Use Bylaw to redistrict a small parcel of land in the Thomas Creek development to allow the developer to try out some test home builds to see what the town will support and what the future development may look like. Council also signed a utility right of way agreement with Canadian Fibre Optics & Northern Lights Fibre to allow for the installation of fibre optic internet in our community. Construction is anticipated to begin in the fall of 2023.

September is here and with that so is return to school. I would like to remind everyone to keep your eyes on the roads when driving as we will have many young people returning to school either on foot, bicycle or school buses and even with the increased traffic for those that are being dropped off at the schools, lets keep everyone safe.

Council and administration will begin budget process in the coming months. This is always a grueling task as we try and weigh the needs and wants of the community. We always welcome community input in our budget process. If you would like to make suggestions or have ideas for continued betterment of our community, I urge you to reach out to the town administration and/or one of the Councillors in town so that we can best serve the community.

I would like to end by reminding the public of the upcoming public hearing on September 18th @ 7pm as your opportunity to comment on Bylaw 2022-21 Alternative Advertising Bylaw. This bylaw will change how the town advertises it public notices. The intent is to change from newspaper advertising as the primary method to our town website as the primary method. The cost of newspaper advertising is expensive and only reaches those that have paid subscriptions. The bylaw does allow for additional advertising methods that will be kept in mind such as electronic signs, attachments to utility mail outs and newspaper where applicable. Notice of this public hearing is being sent out in your upcoming utility bill as well.

As summer is wrapping up and kids are preparing for their return to school, I would like to comment on a few events from this summer. First, I must comment on Calmar Days. The heavy rain and wind threw a curve ball on our Friday's activities. The weather was much better Saturday and Sunday, and people got to enjoy the festivities. Saturday started with an awesome pancake breakfast which was well attended (about 600 people). It definitively set the mood for the rest of the day. The breakfast was followed by the parade. With its many participants and spectators, it was a hit. There were also vendors dispersed along 50 Avenue and a few other spots around Town for residents and visitors to explore. This year, the arena was also home to a private market. It appears that the residents liked the diversity offered during the festivities. Saturday's celebration closed with the Cabaret and fireworks.

I cannot wrap up the Calmar Day summary without a huge shoutout to all the sponsors, volunteers, and Town employees that contributed to making the experience enjoyable. Without these individuals, Calmar Days wouldn't be the same. Lastly, we did take footage (image and videos) of the festivities on Saturday. Once these are ready, we will use our website and social media to share them with the public.

Another summer event that I would like to comment on is the unsightly/weed management enforcement done by the Town. As we all have seen, most properties were well maintained during the summer, but some were neglected. The Town did an enforcement campaign, and we learned a lot from it. For next year, we intend to work more closely with the developers and owners of the vacant lots to minimize/avoid the negative impacts of unmanaged properties/weeds. We are also going to manage the public lands differently as we have notice weeds on them as well. Lastly, we will likely conduct an education and awareness campaign earlier in spring to make sure that everyone understands the responsibilities and expectations before the enforcement campaign begins.

Lastly, I would like to comment on a discussion that came out in social media related to the 51 Avenue/Street sanitary repairs. Based on discussion held with residents and Council, it appears some residents are not aware that they may not own the land in front of their house all the way to the curb. Often, the Town's Road Right-of-Way (RRW) goes beyond the physical street and sometimes there could be a Utility Right-of Way (URW) on the front of a property. The Town and other parties can install the infrastructure/utilities that are necessary for the Town to operate in these Right-of-Ways. This information is typically located on your real property report and/or plan or survey. If you do not have one or need help understanding your situation, you can always reach out to the Town. We will help you better understand the boundaries of your property and the instruments that may impact it.



NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION

DESCRIPTION OF VISUAL ELEMENTS

Among the various visual elements illustrating Indigenous cultures, the circle is at the center which represents being together in a spirit of reconciliation. The orange colour represents truth-telling and healing. The First Nations, Inuit and Métis are represented in the image.

*Smoke is used in different ways by all three Indigenous groups in Canada. Whether it is to smoke fish and meat, to burn sage and tobacco or for sacred ceremonies, it is a significant symbol in Indigenous culture.

DESCRIPTION OF THE THREE ICONS




The eagle to represent the First Nations


