MAYORS CORNER

Happy New Year to Everyone!

January: Sparkling winter sunshine, face all aglow, making resolutions, and angels in the snow – steaming cups of cocoa, a year that's fresh and new...all of this is magic – unfolding just for you.

2023 has come and gone and our community remains one of the coolest communities I know. Over the year we have seen continued change and growth in our community. We welcomed newcomers both business and residential. The town completed a major sewer replacement during the year and signed a utility right of way access to allow for the installation of fibre optic internet into our community to support the request of residents and businesses alike. We also welcomed aboard an additional Community Peace Officer to help keep our community safe.

The new year is a fresh start to many things but can be a tough month as we cope with the weather and the bills that come in from the seasons celebration. If you need help with these new year's blues, please reach out to our FCSS, as we are here to help. The library always has fun activities every month, but in January this is a great way to keep active while staying warm indoors. First Night will be December 31st. Come out and celebrate the new year with friends, family and neighbours. Our celebrations continue to be a great success in our community.

After more than 3 months of hard work, Council was able to pass Calmar's interim budget at its December 18th meeting with the following key highlights:

- Council held several public meetings since October 2 as well as one public open house to discuss the budget.
- The budget is considered interim as Council will have the ability to amend it in the first quarter of 2024, once the final property assessments have been finalized.
- Despite significant operational expense increases for 2024, Council is aiming to contain budget increases to 3.5%. This increase will cover increased operational costs, as well as build our reserve funding for major infrastructure projects that will be upcoming in the future.
- With the continued increase in operations around the board, the overall budget is passing from 7.094 million to 7.324 million.
- 2024 capital budget is \$1.1 million. Most of these funds will be invested in sanitary infrastructure and road repaving. With the many items we need to address and limited government funding, we will need to chip away slowly at the projects.
- Other capital items that are planned are; a walking trail behind the high school, linking the east side of the high school to the west side of the high school, that did not happen in 2023, replacement of lagoon aerators, and repairs to fencing at the ball diamonds at the Calmar Outdoor Recreation Grounds.

Over the next 5 years, \$9.6 million could be injected into the community on various projects. Council will need to identify priorities. Council will use its Asset Management Committee to help the decision-making process, but residents and members of the business communities will need to play their part and let Council know what infrastructure is important to them.

Council and I are excited about 2024 as we continue to work on new development opportunities that will be new to our community and greatly welcomed. Council is dedicated to continuing to strive for improvement in our community with continued levels of services, changes to our policy and bylaws that will enhance the opportunity for our community to flourish into the future. I toast our entire community and look forward to the excitement of a new year with continued success in our great town.

Snow clearing of the sidewalk, yard mowing/cleaning, traffic regulations obedience, and animal registering, are all activities governed by the Town's bylaws. Please follow the rules/regulations and be the best resident (and neighbour) you can be.

Hoping that 2024 will bring you all joy and happiness, that you will remain healthy, and that you will succeed in your undertakings.

FCSS - Did you know?

Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) is a Municipal/Provincial cost-shared program that provides information regarding social and emotional supports that are available to residents of Calmar.

Through FCSS, many services, activities and programs are made available with the intention of promoting and enhancing family and community life. Volunteerism and prevention are emphasized, and FCSS helps the community help itself. Services and programs are varied, depending on the need.

Information and referrals play an important role for FCSS. Anyone who requires information, referrals or support on social, community or personal issues, may contact the FCSS office. Although counselling is not available through our local office, the FCSS Coordinator can provide information and assistance with obtaining counselling. Confidentiality is protected.

In collaboration with Leduc County, the Town of Calmar FCSS department provides referral services for several programs currently being offered, including;

Encourage fellow neighbours to get together and connect




There are two categories for nominations and one from each category will be selected (Youth 12-17 yrs old) and Adult (18+). Each recipient of the Good Neighbour award will receive:

Providing resources and supports for mental health at Black Gold

It is a sad statistic that 4,500 people across Canada succumb to suicide annually - the equivalent to 12 lives lost each day. In response, the 9-8-8 Suicide Crisis Helpline, which provides immediate access to suicide prevention services via call or text - 24/7, free of charge was recently launched to prioritize mental health for all Canadians.

The Black Gold School Division's Ward 2 Trustee Devonna Klaassen is proud to have been part of a team of dedicated people who worked hard to advocate for this much-needed service.

"Prior to becoming a school trustee, I worked for 15-plus years at the Support Network," said Trustee Klaassen. "Suicide prevention was a cornerstone of their crisis programs. Over the years I not only served in all programs at some point, but eventually ended up overseeing all of them as the director."

"The 9-8-8 helpline - an easy to remember number - helps to reduce barriers to access."

Klaassen said that her experiences working directly with youth in crisis, was a major driver for her to pursue a role as a school trustee. "I know what the system looks like on the other side of education, so I wanted to put my skills and experience to use supporting kids and families from within the education system and support opportunities to strengthen the overlaps between the two." she said.

Mental health has long been a cornerstone within all Black Gold schools. "Supporting the mental health of students, staff and families requires a complex strategy, involving many layers and community partnerships," said Student Services Director Niki Gill.

There are comprehensive supports available to students and staff in all Black Gold schools, including the Division's <u>Mental Health Capacity Building</u> team, an Alberta Health Service school-linked mental health nurse, as well as educational psychologists, and occupational therapists. Each school has family school liaison workers, school counsellors, wellness instructional support teachers, and mental health lead teachers.

"We also rely heavily on our community partnerships to support families holistically," said Gill.

"These include Family and Community Supports Services, the Family Resource Network, Mental Health and Addictions, Settlement Workers in Schools, food banks, primary care networks, and many local area businesses who donate to our schools to support needs like food insecurity, school supplies, or warm clothing."

Happy New Year and Cheers to 2024! With the holidays behind us and much of winter still ahead, January and February can be difficult months for many folk. The days are short and roads make for messy travel- the winter blues set in and we yearn for warmer months. Winter is a time for rest, but society tells us we need to keep going. What if this year could be different? What if this year you intentionally slowed down, spared some energy and tuned into taking care of your 'self'?

Very few of us have made it into adult life unscathed- yet even fewer of us were equipped with coping skills and the ability to communicate our needs effectively. Then we add the cultural conditioning we experience that tells us our emotions don't matter and we need to tough it out. Our culture takes pride in burnout and over-achieving; yet we are the most anxious and depressed we've ever been. Our bodies are literally storing the emotions and trauma's we have experienced; and it's making us sick.

Muscle tension, aches and pains, frequent headaches, GI (gut) issues, heart disease, high blood pressure, chronic fatigue and so many other symptoms are often a direct result of a "dysregulated nervous system" - or stored emotional pain and/or chronic stress.

This year we will offer a stop by step guide to building resilience, letting go of past trauma and emotion, stress management, self-growth and expanding joy in life. But first, we need to introduce the importance of a mind-body (embodied) approach to healing.

When we focus in on a specific symptom or ailment, we miss the bigger picture which can lead to misdiagnosis and not getting to the root of the issue. When we only treat the symptom and not the underlying cause; a new symptom will appear. Then we treat it, and again miss the cause. We get stuck in a cycle of symptom treatment- but when we take that holistic and embodied approach we are able to identify and treat the root, eliminating the appearance of new symptoms. We heal.

The first step to healing is slowing down- even if it's only for 5 minutes. Giving our nervous systems a chance to pause and reset. As you move through January, I invite you to try something new. Set an alarm for the same time each day (this helps build consistency) and give yourself permission to breathe deeply for 5 minutes. Sit or lay in a comfortable position and close your eyes/ soften your gaze. Breathe in through your nose and out through your mouth as if you were pushing air through a straw. Breathe in for a count of 4 and out for a count of 6, repeat this 10-20 times. This breathing technique activates what is called our 'parasympathetic response' which kicks our bodies out of stress mode and forces us to relax. Its starting point in turning i nward and gaining awareness of our 'selves'.






