In The Know with the CAO

Over the last few weeks, I talked about two topics that we rarely discuss in the municipal world. I thought that it may be good to bring these into my article this month as more residents may be curious. The first one is the application of pesticides and/or herbicides. Although these products may serve good purposes, if not use properly, can create significant issues and/or damage. Therefore, following label instructions, wearing the recommended personal protective equipment, and adhering to guidelines for storage, mixing, and application significantly reduce the risk of exposure, environmental contamination, and unintended harm. The Town of Calmar does not regulate the application of these products. The Government of Alberta (GoA) has adopted several acts and regulations to deal with pests, weeds, and nuisances. For more information and prior to usage of these products, residents are encouraged to visit the Alberta.ca website.

The second topic I would like to discuss is the metal container often referred to as "seacontainers" "sea-cans", "pods", or "moving pods". The reality is that these containers are typically used for storing items, merchandises, and/or personal goods. In Calmar, these are regulated by the Land Use Bylaw and are limited to the industrial areas. However, exceptions are made as a temporary measure when a person is moving, renovating, or building. For these exceptions, the containers will be allowed on site for the length of the activity (short term) and will have to be removed as soon as the moving, renovation, or construction is done. Furthermore, the containers should never be located on the street unless of special circumstances and only with the approval of the Town as placing objects other than registered vehicles on the street can create significant public hazard. For more information about containers, please reach out to the Town.





Development Permit vs. Building Permit

What's the Difference?

What is a Development Permit?

Thinking about building, renovating, or adding something new to your property?

You might need a Development Permit first!



What it is:

Approval from the Town to make sure your project follows the Land Use Bylaw (district regulations).



What it checks:

- Is your project allowed in that district?
- Does it meet setbacks, height limits, and lot coverage rules?
- Is the use of the building permitted (e.g., home business, garage, secondary suite)?



Adding a garage, a new deck, changing a building's use.



Who issues:

Town Development Authority

What is a Building Permit?

Thinking about building, renovating, or adding something new to your property?

You might need a Building Permit!



What it is:

Approval to ensure your project meets the Alberta Building Code for safety and structural standards.



What it checks:

- Proper foundation, framing, insulation, and roofing
- Electrical, plumbing, and gas work
- Fire safety and code complaince



Finishing a basement, building a house, installing plumbing or electrical work



Who issues:

Safety Codes Officers (Superior Safety Codes)

Development Permit = Planning approval (where and what)
Building Electrical, Plumbing and Gas Permit = Safety approval

WHO CAN VOTE IN CALMAR'S MUNICIPAL ELECTION?

To vote in the 2025 municipal election in Calmar, you must be:

- At least 18 years of age;
- A Canadian citizen;
- · A resident of the Town of Calmar on the day you vote; and,
- Produce one piece of ID issued by a Canadian government, whether federal, provincial or local, or an agency of that government, that contains a photograph of the person.

DON'T FORGET TO REGISTER TO VOTE!

To be ready to vote, please <u>confirm that your information is correct</u> with Voterlink, where the Town receives its list of eligible voters. The website can be found here https://www.voterlink.ab.ca/ and click the 'Am | Registered to Vote' button.

Nature as Medicine: Simple Summer Practices to Reconnect

August is the height of summer—when nature is in full bloom, daylight lingers, and the earth invites us to slow down, breathe deeper, and remember ourselves. At Nurtured Minds Wellness and Therapy Services, we believe that nature is more than just a backdrop—it's an active partner in healing.

More and more, research affirms what many of us instinctively know: time in nature supports mental health. It helps regulate the nervous system, lowers stress hormones, improves mood, and fosters a sense of connection—both inwardly and outwardly. But you don't need to escape to the mountains or commit to a long hike to experience these benefits. You can start small, right here in Calmar.

Here are three simple summer practices to reconnect with nature—and yourself:

1. The 5 Senses Grounding Walk

Head out to your backyard, a local trail, or even your front steps. Pause and engage each of your senses:

- What are five things you can see?
- What are four things you can hear?
- What are three things you can feel?
- What are two things you can smell?
- What is one thing you can taste?

This somatic practice helps anchor you in the present moment—where healing begins.

2. Barefoot Time on the Earth

Kick off your shoes and feel the grass, dirt, or sand beneath your feet. This simple act of "earthing" can calm your mind and reset your body's stress response. Let it be a daily ritual, even if just for a few minutes.

3. Sit Spot Stillness

Choose a spot in nature to return to regularly. It could be a shady tree, a quiet garden bench, or a spot near the creek. Sit in silence, let your senses open, and notice how the space changes over time—and how you change, too.

In our fast-paced, always-online world, nature offers something we deeply crave: presence, rhythm, and gentle belonging. It teaches us how to slow down, how to be, and how to heal.

This August, we invite you to step outside—not to "do" more, but to simply be. Nature is ready to meet

you. All you have to do is show up.

At Nurtured Minds we offer a holistic wellness checkup- this article has been created based on the foundations of that session.
