With this year's municipal election, Calmar had two advance polling dates as well as election day on October 20th, and while turnout felt to be better than last election (which was our largest turnout) the numbers suggest that it fell short of the 2021 election. Final numbers this year had 443 voters (as compared to 546 in 2021) come and have their say. Elections Alberta had just under 1700 people registered and eligible to vote in Calmar, add to that the approximately 60 people that needed to be added to the register when they turned up to vote, it meant our turnout was approximately 25% of eligible voters.

Next, I want to say thank you to the candidates for their campaign efforts and cooperation throughout the election period, to the staff that helped make the voting days run smooth and pain free with the new processes put in place by the Province for this year's election (the permanent electors register). And to all the residents that turned up to vote on any of the three days, thank you for being cooperative, friendly and patient with us as we navigated the new processes.

Lastly, congratulations to the elected officials that will be representing Calmar on the municipal stage for the next four years. We look forward to seeing what you will achieve for our Town.





Winter Safety Starts Early

As the temperatures drop and the first snowflakes start to fall, the Leduc RCMP are reminding residents that a little preparation now can make a big difference later. Winter in Alberta can be unpredictable, but with some early planning, we can all help keep our roads and communities safe.

Before you head out this season, take a moment to get your vehicle winter-ready.

- Check your tires- winter tires or all-weather tires provide better traction when the roads get icy.
- Make sure your windshield washer fluid is topped up
- Keep a winter safety kit in your car that includes a blanket, flashlight, shovel, and booster cables.

Visibility also becomes more important as daylight hours shorten.

Drivers are encouraged to slow down and clear off all windows and lights before hitting the road.

Pedestrians can help by wearing reflective clothing or carrying a small light when walking at night or early in the morning.

If you're new to winter driving, give yourself extra time to reach your destination and avoid sudden stops or lane changes. And remember, if you see emergency or tow vehicles stopped on the side of the road, slow down and move over when it's safe to do so.

What is a Development Permit?

Thinking about building, renovating, or adding something new to your property?

You might need a Development Permit first!



What it is:

Approval from the Town to make sure your project follows the Land Use Bylaw (district regulations).



What it checks:

- Is your project allowed in that district?
- Does it meet setbacks, height limits, and lot coverage rules?
- Is the use of the building permitted (e.g., home business, garage, secondary suite)?



Adding a garage, a new deck, changing a building's use.



Who issues:

Town Development Authority

What is a Building Permit?

You might need a Building Permit!



What it is:

Approval to ensure your project meets the Alberta Building Code for safety and structural standards.



What it checks:

- Proper foundation, framing, insulation, and roofing
- Electrical, plumbing, and gas work
- Fire safety and code complaince



Finishing a basement, building a house, installing plumbing or electrical work



Who issues:

Safety Codes Officers (Superior Safety Codes)

Development Permit = Planning approval (where and what)
Building Electrical, Plumbing and Gas Permit = Safety approval

Caring for Our Mental Health in Rural Alberta

Living in a small rural community brings many strengths. People often know their neighbors by name, lend a hand when someone is in need, and enjoy the peace and quiet of wide-open spaces. At the same time, living outside of a city can create unique challenges when it comes to mental health. Long and sometimes isolating winters and the stress that comes with farming, working away from home, or parenting children can all affect emotional well-being.

Mental health is just as important as physical health. Many of us would not think twice about seeing a doctor for a broken bone or an infection, yet we might hesitate to seek help when struggling with stress, depression, or anxiety. It is important to remember that emotional challenges are not a sign of weakness. They are a normal part of being human, and everyone needs support at different points in life.

There are many small but powerful ways to care for mental health in daily life. Staying connected with others is one of the most effective. Whether it is attending a local community event, stopping to talk with a neighbor, or making time for a phone call with family, these moments of connection help ease loneliness and strengthen resilience.

Spending time outside is another helpful tool. Research shows that being in nature can lower stress and lift mood. Rural communities are fortunate to have access to open skies, quiet trails, and fresh air. Even a short walk down a gravel road or time spent in a backyard garden can create a sense of calm.

Talking openly about mental health can also make a difference. Many people carry heavy burdens in silence because they fear being judged. Sharing how we feel with someone we trust, whether it is a friend, a family member, or a professional, can help lighten the load. These conversations can also help reduce stigma in our community. When we talk about mental health as openly as we talk about physical health, we send a clear message that it is okay to ask for help. Calmar is fortunate to have mental health support available right here in town. At Nurtured Minds Wellness, our team of therapists is dedicated to meeting you exactly where you are in your journey. We take a holistic approach that honors the connection between body and mind, recognizing that true well-being comes when both are cared for together.

Mental health challenges can feel heavy, but no one needs to carry them alone. Reaching out for support is a sign of courage. Every conversation, every act of kindness, and every effort to care for ourselves and others helps strengthen the fabric of our community.

Together, as neighbors, friends, and family members, we can make mental health a priority. Small towns thrive when people look out for each other. By building a culture where it is safe to talk about emotional struggles and safe to ask for help, we ensure that our communities remain strong, resilient, and compassionate places to live.
